





This café is famous for their specialty coffee and they also offer sandwiches for snacks. Make sure to try their Single Origin Aeropress (P160) as you visit the place. Although it's a bit secluded, Habitual's interiors and high ceiling makes the place stand out from the inside. Drop by the crossfit gym and bike shop at the compound next time you visit!





Población Dining Room

Hidden inside Commune Café and Bar in Makati, you may think you'll get a different vibe because of the sudden shift in roles. Poblacion Dining Room is as Filipino as it gets. Once you've been taken through its doors, you'll feel like you've walked into your grandmother's house. Filipinos will get a hint of nostalgia with how it's set up: there are several small tables where everyone can eat and chat, and one long table (made by putting the small ones together) to have big groups sit down, eat, and chat. Check out their trademark Sinampalukang Manok (chicken in tamarind soup base) for P280 that will remind you of your grandmother's cooking!








Bank Bar — PP




Bar IE-





Mackerel 1 can 150 g Pasta 1 pc Okra 1/2 clove Red Onion 5 g Ginger 1 tbsp Miso paste 1 tbsp Kikkoman 1 tsp Sugar 1/4 cup Water Salt & Pepper Lemon Slices



Procedure:

- 1. Cook the pasta according to packet instructions. Boil okra in the same pan.
- 2. Open the mackerel can and separate the oil.
- 3. For the sauce, sauté red onion, red bell pepper and ginger in a saucepan. Add the mackerel oil.



- Turning Wheels Craft Brewery's Mountain King IPA (7% ABV) Mountain King IPA is a West Coast style IPA that has an intense hop aroma and recognizable bitterness, with explosion of flavors from grapefruit, pineapple, and citrus. Mountain King IPA is available at Alamat Pub and Deli in Makati for P280.
- 3 Craftpoint Liberation Pale Ale (5.5% ABV) Liberation Pale Ale is perfect for drinkers who want a more flavorful experience with their beer. A Belgian Pale Ale, it is a blend of Belgian yeasts and American Pale Ale and give off a caramel maltiness, tropical fruit notes, and a floral fragrance with bitterness. You can get it at The Bottle Shop, Smoky Bastard, and The Perfect Pint for P200-P275.
- 4 Joe's Brew Sierra Madre Wheat Ale (4.3% ABV) Sierra Madre is an American Pale wheat ale style beer that has a light, fruity flavour with hints of banana. Pivo Praha's Dark Lager is a Czech-style beer made from a mix of barley, caramel, black malt, hops, and yeast. It gives off rich caramel undertones and a sweet rather that bitter aftertaste. Get it at Pivo Praha microbrewery in Makati for only P95/300ml and P135/500ml at Alamat Filipino Pub for P190 per bottle.
- Fat Pauly's Iligan Single Hop Origin Pale Ale (7.4% ABV) Iligan Single Hop Origin Pale Ale is a classic pale ale style using a single hop variety harvested only in a specific hop farm. It is made from brew-grade malt and ingredients endemic from lligan City. This crisp beer is deceptively strong with a hint of sweetness. Iligan Single Hop Origin Pale Ale can be found in Alamat Filipino Pub and Deli and Big Bad Wolf for P275-P350.

Pugaw (Earthworld) India Pale Ale is Baguio Craft's American style beer that has a high hop flavor and bitterness, with citrus and pine notes. - Palawan Honey Kolsch (6.5% ABV) Palaweño Brewery is the first and only craft beer brewery in Palawan, Philippines. One of its famous local craft beers is the Palawan Honey Kolsch, a "tribal beer." It is a German style beer made with native Palawan Honey. It is available at The Bottle Shop and Smoky Bastard for P250.
- Pedro Brewcrafters' Endless Summer Wheat Ale (5% ABV) Pedro Brewcrafters is a microbrewery based in San Pedro Laguna. Its first beer is the Endless Summer Wheat Ale, a citrus beer with a hint of toasted nuts. It has a crisp note, perfect for those who prefer a sweet, semi-fruity flavour, and nutty finish. Endless Summer Wheat Ale can be found at Smoky Bastard for P200.





Espasol

It's a rice cake that the world can't seem to understand, yet Filipinos know by heart. Espasol is a cylinder-shaped rice cake that's a specialty in Laguna, Liliw is where you can find some of the best. It's made from rice flour cooked in coconut milk and sweetened coconut strips, dusted with toasted rice flour. They might look like rolls of paper, but once you open them you'll be in for a surprise. Espasol has a smoky and (sometmes) nutty flavor that will have you looking for more. It's the perfect pasalubong from Liliw for anyone who wants snacks but doesn't want to go too deep into snacking on sweet rice cakes. You can find espasol in nearly every store selling pasalubong in Liliw for about P100 for 3 pieces.

Entrada

Capiz Shell

Capiz shell comes from windowpane oysters, which used to be a staple in Filipino homes because of its name-sake. Their shells are commonly used as materials for window panes, giving ancestral Filipino homes a touch of local you can't find anywhere else. It's also seen as a material for lampshades, but some shops in Liliw have taken it a step further and made something you hardly see nowadays: capiz shell bowls. These decorative bowls will give your dining room and kitchen counters that same touch of local flair you can't get otherwise, unless you go all out and buy locally-made bowls and plates. @ Gat. 6 St. John the Baptist Parish Church

Towns in the Philippines were built around churches during the Spanish occupation. The baroque-style church was built in 1605 to honor St. John the Baptist and is sometimes referred to as the Liliw or Lilio Church. It has since been preserved and developed by its parishioners in an effort to restore it to its former glory. One of the church's most endearing features is its magnificent façade. The beautiful architecture makes for great photos, especially if you are someone who loves churches. Parking is also not a problem if you're visiting Liliw Church, as it acts as the town's parking space. Masses are held here at 6 am on Mondays, Thursdays, and Saturdays. Afternoon masses (5:15 pm) are held every Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday. Sunday masses start at 6 am.



A tropical rainforest paradise



The largest of the three spring pool areas at Hidden Valley, it's also one of the first to be used for tourists. The water comes from a natural spring, and is warmed by geothermal pockets found between Mt. Makiling and Mt. Banahaw. There are three warm pools at Hidden Valley Springs arranged in levels. The top-most pool is the shallowest at around 3-4 feet deep and can fit probably 6-10 people at a time. The pool at the middle is a bit bigger and a little deeper than the first: around four and a half feet to five feet deep. The largest of the three pools is found at the foot of the area, and is four feet deep. No temperature was given, but rest assured these pools will not scald or burn anyone who jumps in, even without the usual "adjustment period" to the temperature of the



By far one of the better-known spring pools in Hidden Valley Springs, the Soda Pools are a bit of a rare treat. Water from the source of the pool tastes a lot like soda but without too much fizz. Some people have said you only need to add a bit of sugar to make it taste like Sprite. There are two Soda Pools in Hidden Valley Springs, both of which are between four and five feet deep. Soda Pool One is the more "kid-friendly" of the two pools. The other one is half of an Olympic-size swimming pool, complete with pontoons and guides for those who want to go for a few laps.



Lover's Pool

The Lover's Pool is the perfect fit for couples (or singles) who are looking for a bit of privacy from the small crowd Hidden Valley Springs gets every now and then. It's tucked away just after the Soda Pools and gives you a great view of the lush rainforest that Hidden Valley is in. The pool isn't that deep (around 4 or 5 feet), but the location makes it perfect for those who are looking for some time to themselves. It's a bit of a walk from the Warm Pools and the cottages, but that short walk is worth it once you see what Lover's Pool has in store.



Hidden Falls

Hidden Valley isn't the only secret lodged between Mt. Makiling and Mt. Banahaw. The resort itself hides yet another secret, one that you have to work hard to get to: the Hidden Falls. It's a 30-minute hike from the pool areas, and can be accessed through the fallen century-old tree. The hike to the falls is a good way to start your day, especially if you're looking for a workout. However, don't fret if you think it's an actual hike; you'll be on a bamboo bridge-like footpath nearly all the way to the Hidden Falls. Once you're there, all that's left is to take in the beauty of the falls. The waters are cold, though no one is allowed to swim in them. It's best if you come to the falls wearing slippers or anything that you're not afraid to get wet in; that way, you can get a closer look.



Golf Course

Hidden Valley hides more than natural springs and a spectacular waterfall. The very entrance of the resort hides behind it something which businessmen often enjoy during their spare time: golf. Hidden Valley Springs has its own golf course and putting green. The course has nine holes, and, from what we saw, has between par 3 and par 4 holes. It also has several holes reserved for putting practice, as well as a small driving range for those who just want to practice their swing. The course is maintained, but was under a bit of landscaping at the time because people don't spend as much time on it compared to other parts of the resort. For information on green fees and tee times, please talk to the resort's front desk.

Restaurant





The restaurant at Hidden Valley Springs isn't as spectacular as, say, restaurants in places like Makati, BGC, or even tourist hot beds like Boracay and Palawan, but the food here is good. They change their menu for every meal, but the general theme stays the same: buffet-style dining with either Filipino favorites or international staples. Their lunch buffet usually features Filipino favorites such as roasted chicken, squid adobo, the spicy Beef Caldereta, Lechon Kawali, and Pancit, though these could change depending on whatever is in season. There's no shortage of space at the restaurant in Hidden Valley Springs. They have an in-house singing group that will go from table to table, singing classics and recent hits.





The best part about their buffet-style restaurant: it's free! You can have as much as you want since it's included in the rate you pay. In case you're wondering, yes even those on a day tour can enjoy meals at the restaurant. Breakfast starts around 7am, with lunch being served around 11am. You can also enjoy afternoon snacks around 2pm or 3pm, with dinner service starting at 5pm.

Casitas at Hidden Valley Springs



You'll feel a surge of Filipino culture and architecture when you stay at Hidden Valley Springs. You have two types of accommodation to choose from at Hidden Valley: the 2-person Casita De Luxe and the 6-person Casita De Luxe with loft. Both casitas are designed with Filipino culture in mind. From the outside, each casita looks like a bahay kubo or nipa hut, the traditional Filipino house. It's decked out with a flat-screen TV that has cable, it's air conditioned, and comes with either one or three beds (the ones with a loft come with three).





The Casita De Luxe come in at P12,500 for one room (good for two people), while the ones with the loft come start at P15,000 for two adults. These rates are inclusive of welcome drinks, meals, and full use of the resort's amenities and facilities.

Space Port





Brooklyn Place









Review

I have straight hair, which made me worry if I can curl my hair using only the heat of the hair dryer. After using it for 10 minutes, I got a fluffy curl! All I did was use it the way a hairdresser would use a curler: wrap your hair around the comb while pulling, then carefully pull out the dryer so that your hair will keep its shape. Doing it this way made it easier to curl my hair and reduced the time I style my hair.

Negative ions released from the comb prevented my hair from being frizzy. It curls your hair without drying because the

temperature is lower compared to hair irons in addition to the negative ion that will coat your hair.

If you need more options for styling your hair, make sure to use the other attachments. Use the blow brush to curl your hair inwards. For tight curls, use the Slim Roller Brush with a 360-degree comb. If you want loose curls or a way to style your bangs, I recommend using the big Roller Brush.




they use when they study —writing utensils, notepads, art supplies, etc. Have drawers and containers for them to put their things away in, as well as bins and boxes for any of their prized projects.

Business Talk

An interview with the top executives in the Philippines Get a first person point of view when it comes to business



When and how did you get to start in the fashion industry?

We started Bench in 1987 and are celebrating 30th anniversary this year. We are thirty years young, and we remain a youthful brand. Every day for us in the fashion industry is a fresh start.

What made you decide to get into the world of fashion?

It would be my inclination towards aesthetics and eye for beauty. I suppose I was only waiting for the right medium for me to express that creatively. After years of study, seeing the world, and a bit of experimentation, my calling turned out to be in fashion retail.

When was Bench launched and what was the idea behind it?

Bench was launched in 1987. I put up a fashion label under my own name at a time when I felt there was something lacking in the local industry and decided to focus on it.

We started out as a T-shirt brand in a corner of SM Department Store (now SM Store). It was small, but we already had a distinct look and design to our brand. Shoppers at SM noticed that and patronized it, which led to the brand's rapid growth.

What other clothing brands or product lines do you own apart from Bench?

Locally, we own the street wear line Human, Kashieca (a clothing line for young ladies), the contemporary furniture store Dimensione, Bench Skin Expert, Bench Fix Salon, Bench Barbers, and PCX - a complete cosmetics and beauty shop.

We're also the local distributor for the following international brands: Cotton On and Cotton On Kids from Australia, Vero Moda from Denmark, American Eagle,

curated multi-brand store Assembly, Aldo (shoes) and Call It Spring (accessories) from Canada, Charles + Keith and Pedro (shoes and bags) from Singapore, and Korea's Face Shop.

We also carry the *UK's Cath Kidston* (clothing, bags, and accessories), *Paul Smith* (luxury apparel and accessories), *FOX clothing* from *Israel*, *Under Armour*, *Cappelini*, *Fritz Hansen*, *Magis*, and *MDF Italia*.

Rounding out the list is the international home and office furniture line *Foscarini*, Australia's *Rubi shoes*, *Origins*, *Jo Malone*, *Bobby Brown*, and cosmetic and fragrance brands *Kiehl's*, and *Estee Lauder*.

What separates Bench from other brands?

Bench has a distinct and irresistible taste that you can't get anywhere else, hence giving us one of our tag lines: Live life with flavor.

A Bench shirt will have something extra that Pinoys look for and can relate to; something that gives them the feeling of being home. You can't put a price on that. All you can do is experience that feeling.

Your brand was the first to use celebrity endorsers at a time when it wasn't the norm. What made you decide to do so?

We didn't just want to sell clothing; we wanted to create an image for the brand. We decided that the best way to do this is to tap a celebrity who embodied that image, which at that time was Richard Gomez (Filipino TV Personality).

Something magical happened when we put him in a rowboat for our first TVC in 1991. It won many awards and is now considered a classic. It also set the formula for how Bench would choose and promote its celebrity endorsers in the years to come.

We were the first in the Philippine market to do something that other big global brands did during the 90s, and Filipinos loved it.

We heard that you started Bench as a "one-man team." Was that the biggest hurdle you got over or were there bigger ones that came along the way?

Bench was not a one-man effort. I worked side by side with my sister Nenita Lim, who is our VP for Finance. Her husband, Virgilio Lim, is our president. I am very fortunate that the three of us work well together as a team; we offset our own strengths and weaknesses.

The biggest hurdle we faced was globalization. We saw the Philippine fashion, textile, and retail industries transform before our eyes. In many respects, the country was not prepared for globalization, and that was a difficult hurdle we had to overcome. Global competition to this day remains fierce, and it is a battle we face every day.

What is Bench doing to keep up with local and global competitors?

The game today revolves around information and what to do with it. If you want to stay relevant, you have to be in the loop with everything that's going on.

You can't miss a beat. You either keep up with the times or get left behind. Technologically, you have to be at par with the best of the best.

What are your plans for Suyen Corporation?

We want to expand in every direction that has a potential for growth. We're catering to a new generation whose needs and demands are remarkably distinct from the previous ones.

Today's millennials require us to expand our thinking and see the brand with fresh eyes. We need to know when to retain what's tried and true and when to reinvent ourselves. It takes us out of some of our comfort zones, which helps us evolve and grow.

What would you consider as your greatest professional success? What about your biggest setback?

I consider being in the business for 30 years as my mark for success. Longevity is hard to achieve, and our brand is still going and growing to this day. I also don't believe in setbacks; instead, I view each challenge as an opportunity to be better.

How would you describe the way you manage your company?

I do it by intuition. It's a family-run company with my sister, her husband, their children, and myself running the show. Naturally, we treat our employees as our extended family.

Back in July, we celebrated our 30th anniversary by taking employees who have been with us for at least a decade on a trip to Hong Kong. That turned out to be 400 employees, which includes both local and overseas operations!

We filled an entire plane, and the whole trip turned out to be more than a team building experience. It cemented our bond as a company, and made the trip unforgettable.

What's a typical day of work like for you?

No days are alike for me. I'm constantly traveling and meeting new people. Even if I'm in Manila for three consecutive days, each one will still be different from the other.

What quote/phrase do you live by?

I used to have one in the 90s from Irish author Jonathan Swift: "Vision is the art of seeing the invisible."

However, with the many wise quotes I see on my Instagram feed each day, I get a new and better mantra. I guess that's just a reflection of how the world is today.
