




GOLFING in JAPAN

The Golf Scene in Japan You Didn't Know About

More and more people are discovering the golfing culture in Japan. It is now time for you to explore this new destination.



DOORS HAVE BEEN OPENED

When Kobe Golf Club was born in 1903 in Kobe, it was said to be the beginning of golf history in Japan.

Since the first golf course was built in Japan, the golfing community in the country expanded quickly, with the number of golf courses reaching 2,400 and the number of golf players reaching 15 million by 1995. It was a huge industry, made up not only of golf courses but also golf equipment providers and driving ranges.

It's a well-known fact that the Japanese economic growth was driven in part by the golf industry, but when the economy declined in 1993, the number of players started to drop and never recovered. The huge number of golf players brought not only good things to the golf industry but also brought about a bad practice—golf courses didn't see the need to promote their business because the huge domestic market was enough for them.

When golf players decreased to 7 million in 2012, golf courses were forced to drop their prices. Between 1995 and 2012, the number of golfers dropped by almost 50%, while the number of golf courses dropped by only 4%, with at least 2,300 courses still operational. This kind of imbalance shows a strange golf scene in Japan. Most golf courses are struggling to survive with only 5 million golfers and greatly reduced green fees.

Since 2012, sporting events, such as the Tokyo Olympics in 2020, have been confirmed to take place in Japan; therefore, the Japanese government has redirected their attention to the tourism industry. The Japanese government has strongly encouraged businesses to upgrade, improve, and prepare for the next few years, to take part in the largely expected tourism boom. In fact, a lot of foreigners have visited Japan since the Japanese government opened its doors and eased visa rules for Southeast Asian tourists in 2012.

With the promising state of tourism in Japan, golf courses have finally found new opportunities to reach international markets since 2016.

The time has come for Japan to once again open its doors to the golfing community all over the world and continue its long history since 1903.

THE MOST EXCITING PART OF GOLFING IN JAPAN

Japan has always been a popular country to travel with its variety of tourist spots. Its features have inspired many people around the world.

The number of tourists has increased rapidly in the past few years, with almost 24 million people visiting Japan in 2017.

Since Japan is an attractive country to visit, many people may wish to play golf if there were options during their stay. Normally, when we talk about a golf trip, we need to find and select a good golf destination with the best golf course in the country, a famous tournament course, or one with beautiful seafront views. These, however, are not the only charming points of golfing in Japan. A golf trip in Japan also touches on traditional culture, local food, Japanese hospitality, and the country's four beautiful seasons.







1. JEST Camp

Jungle Environment Survival Training Camp, otherwise called JEST Camp, calls itself a "one-stop shop" where visitors can do thrilling activities in nature and enjoy the most delicious camp food. People can learn how to live and survive in the wilderness and work as one with nature. One of their most famous training adventures is the Jungle Survival Course wherein you will undertake challenges that you could not possibly encounter in the city but otherwise quite practical—dealing with mosquitoes or securing your tent amid bad weather.

Among the Jungle Survival Courses, you can choose from Survival Bootcamp (extreme jungle survival with 72-hour certification), Wild Child (overnight jungle survival for kids), Camp Craft (survival training and Boton Falls tour with set lunch) or Hunter-Gatherer (overnight jungle survival with certification). Rates range from P450 to P1,100 per person.

2. Network Jetsports

One of the best and most accessible places to get a good dose of water adventure, Networx Jetsports offers various kinds of activities depending on the level of thrill you seek. newest and most exciting activities is the Flyboard (P4,500/person), first launched in the country by Networx Jetsports. This activity requires guts—you will be propelled high into the air as you stand on the board. This activity is good for 20 minutes and is strictly for those aged 18 years old and above.

3. El Kabayo Stables

El Kabayo Stables is managed by a non-profit organization dedicated to the conservation of species and animal well-being. They offer horseback riding with two trails to choose from (El Kabayo Falls or River Trail) and one-hour or ten-hour riding lessons. You can earn a Certificate of Horsemanship when you complete ten hours. Other activities include harmless horse painting for children or for groups. Rates for horseback riding start at P700/hour.

4. Inflatable Island

Inflatable Island in Zambales is a great side-trip to make when traveling to Subic. The huge floating playground consists of various fun segments like inflatable slides, towers, bridges, human launchers, Tarzan swings, and more. They have a new pink Bali-inspired lounge on the shore, and Unicorn Island which is specially made for kids and kids-at-heart.

Inflatable Island offers one-hour (Sprinkle), two-hour (Splash), half-day (Spray, 8 am to 11:50 am or 2 pm to 6 pm), and whole-day (Soaked) passes. All play passes include a whole-day access to the pink Bali lounge and the floating zoo on a first come first served basis.

5. Pamulaklakin Forest Trail

Pamulaklakin Forest Trail is a great place to immerse in nature and indigenous culture. With activities like the guided ecology tour (P250 for 2-3 hours) and guided jungle tour (P100 for 30 minutes), not only can you better appreciate the pristine nature that's sheltered in Subic but will you also learn some jungle survival skills from the Aetas themselves. An overnight jungle tour is also offered at P500 (plus P50 for every succeeding night). Sightseeing and picture taking only costs P50.

6. Subic Bay Yacht Club

The only yacht club in Subic, Subic Bay Yacht Club, is open to the public, which means that anyone who wishes to have a luxurious getaway can have it at this premier yacht club. The club has around 300 berths that can accommodate 25-ft to 178-ft long watercraft. Subic Bay Yacht Club also offers yacht and boat rental, and yacht cruise packages. A yacht cruise package priced at P21,000 can let a group of up to 20 persons enjoy two hours of luxurious recreation on a yacht with delicious food and beverages.



TIPS:

Subic Bay Freeport Zone's Unique Transportation System

Subic Bay Freeport Zone is only two to three hours away from Manila by car. If commuting, travel time can be a bit longer because of the bus routes and rest stops.

It is best to go to Subic with a private vehicle, but getting around the Central Business District (CBD) is fairly easy without one. Public transportation like buses and jeepneys are not allowed inside Subic Bay Freeport Zone, so the only transport option is taxi. The taxi system in the Freeport Zone is quite unique—they are not metered, but they do have a system.

- Authorized taxis have the SBFZ (Subic Bay Freeport Zone) decal on their body be sure to check!
- Taxis have a fare guide to follow. A ride around the CBD costs P50 to P150.
- If you go out of CBD going to other tourist attractions like Ocean Adventure or the beaches in the southern area, a one-way taxi ride would cost around P300.
- There is no Grab in the Freeport Zone, but the taxis here work pretty much like them. Taxi drivers usually hand out their calling card or contact number, so that you may call them if you need to be picked up at a certain place. If they are not available, they contact other drivers who can pick you up.
- If you don't have a contact on hand, establishments may also call a taxi for you.







Business Talk

An interview with the top executives in the Philippines Get a first person point of view when it comes to business



Ray Refundo is the CEO and founder of Qwikwire, a multi-award-winning startup that provides cross-border payment solutions with its powerful network of banks and payment facilities around the world. He is less on the day-to-day operations and more on Qwikwire's strategic side like getting partnerships with banks from different parts of the world. The startup was founded in 2013 and has been profitable since May 2017.

How long have you been in the tech industry?

For this company, it's been almost five years. I did have another tech company 12 or 15 years ago called MoneyTran, which was an online money transfer service. It didn't work out so it closed down. 10 years after that, I started Qwikwire, so you can say I have been in the industry for as much as 15 years now.

I was born and raised in the Philippines but I went to college in California, Silicon Valley to be exact. The influence there was everywhere, and that's how I got in

Can you share more about how a startup like Qwikwire is built compared to big corporations and companies?

It's more agile. The decision-making is faster. You're also going to make a lot of mistakes but that's the beauty of it: you're allowed to take risks, especially in the beginning. The goal of a startup is to become a big corporation.

Most startups don't have a chief operating officer; that comes in later when the company has grown and needs someone to focus on operations-heavy activity. We don't have that yet. What we do have are a lot of activities that involve marketing, sales, and product development.

What separates your company from other firms that can provide the same type of service?

One of the things that separates us is that we are a US company operating in the Philippines. We are licensed with the US Department of Treasury and we have banking partnerships all over the world, especially in the US. US banks are very sophisticated;

they're able to operate all over the world. We're able to leverage on that and connect to almost every bank account in the world and every credit card you can imagine.

Our greatest strength, however, is our infrastructure, our banking network. Banks in the Philippines don't have the same network that we do. We're also the first to introduce electronic cheques, which as far as we know do not exist even in other countries.

Are there achievements you want to highlight?

We have a new project called AQwire, which is something different from what we currently offer. We realized that the problem our property developers have is access to foreign buyers. What we want to do is to build a marketplace where foreigners can buy real estate easily, anywhere in the world. It's like a marketplace for international real estate.

We want to streamline that process so it's easier for brokers and property developers to be able to sell their units to foreign buyers.

What are some of the challenges that Qwikwire has faced?

The biggest challenge we have now is our ability to scale. We've reached \$1.5 million per month in transactions last June and we should hit \$2 million per month in transactions by September. The problem is we could be doing up to \$7 million a month already, but we missed out on a lot of big payments because we have a limit of \$20,000 per transaction.

Our main problem is not the lack of tech or infrastructure; the challenge comes from us not having earned the trust of both the banks and the property developers yet, which prevents us from operating at full capacity.

I talked to the founder of Flywire, one of the biggest cross-border payment providers for consumers. They told us that there's a lot of problems that will be solved by size, and not by how much you can handle per year. The bigger your company is, the easier it will be for you to get clients. The first five years is really the make or break point for your team. We are in the process of raising \$15 million through a token sale,

which will also include an ICO (Initial Coin Offering) for AQwire outside the Philippines.

What plans do you have for Qwikwire in the foreseeable future?

If the AQwire platform succeeds and becomes big, it will need Qwikwire as its payment system. The bigger AQwire gets, the better it is for Qwikwire. Our goal for the next two to three years is to build on that.

We already have a client in Singapore. The funny thing is we never marketed in Singapore; that client used to be in the Philippines but moved to Singapore. We are planning to open offices in Thailand, the UAE, and the US early next year.

How would you describe the way you manage Qwikwire?

It wasn't perfect, especially in the beginning. I made a lot of mistakes.

The way I manage things is that I tell them our big goal and they figure out how to get there. I don't tell them exactly what to do. They can do it in their own way as long as we get the result.

Take marketing for example. I don't know anything about marketing, so I respect their ideas. I ask questions, but at the end of the day they are still the ones who will do it. They don't even need my approval; they just tell me what they have done.

The way I manage things is that I tell them our big goal and they figure out how to get there. I don't tell them exactly what to do. 77

What has made the most impact on your role as CEO of Qwikwire?

Guidance. I've been fortunate to have the guidance of people who know more than me. Brainsparks (Victor Belen, Artie Lopez, et al.) has given us so much help as far as guiding us in how we can sustainably grow Qwikwire. They were there when we needed guidance and investors.

Do you have a motto or quote you live by?

"Customers first, employees second, shareholders last." - lack Ma

I believe in giving people security. I'm not a "hire slow, fire fast" kind of guy. I'm not like the GM who fires his lowest-performing staff every year. I'm not trying to have everyone compete with each other; that's not the culture we want here. They're also free to make mistakes because they're free to choose and make decisions. I've made a lot of mistakes myself. You won't get in trouble for making a mistake here because even I don't know what the right direction is. The key is to learn from those mistakes and move on.

Message to readers:

A big piece of advice I can give to anyone is the importance of networking. There's a lot of startup advice going around, but I feel that networking is underappreciated and overlooked.

Your success comes from people, and that can only come from the power and size of your network. The more people you know, the more chances you have of being introduced to someone who will eventually open doors for you. We've found the best employees, investors, and clients in these networking events.
