OKYO SKYTREE is an architectural marvel that has been ruling the skies of Eastern Tokyo Metropolis since it was publicly opened in May 2012. Standing 634 meters, it is the world's tallest independent broadcasting tower and the tallest structure in Japan to date.

TOKYO SKYTREE has three major floor groups, each symbolizing the past, the present, and the future of Japan. The Lower Levels serve as an introduction to TOKYO SKYTREE's structure and the culture of "shitamachi" (downtown Tokyo). Up at 340-350 meters is the three-level Tembo Deck, which offers 360-degree views of the city, with facilities like the SKYTREE CAFE, THE SKYTREE SHOP, and the Sky Restaurant 634 (musashi) which serves "new Japanese cuisine," a fusion of traditional Japanese and French culinary techniques.

At 445-450 meters is the spiral Tembo Galleria, where you go on a walking tour from floor 445 up to the Sorakara Point at 451.2m, with views so overwhelming that it might indeed give you a sense of the hopeful future.

ne's TOKYO SKYTREE experience does not end in reaching the topmost observation deck and taking photos of the views. After all, the tower itself is an attraction that should be captured in one's photos, apart from the city scenery viewed from inside the tower.

Yakatabune Amitatsu is a great way of taking in the overall beauty of TOKYO SKYTREE from the outside. "Yakatabune" is a tradition of cruising along Sumida River that has lasted since the Edo period, and Yakatabune Amitatsu is a provider that is almost as old as the tradition, operating for a hundred years

Yakatabune Amitatsu offers the Odaiba Skytree Course which cruises around Asakusa, Tsukiji and Odaiba, and runs for about 2.5 hours. The highlights of the cruise are TOKYO SKYTREE, Rainbow Bridge, and DECKS Tokyo Beach. It has a few branches around the Japan, and Ramen Due Edo Japan is the only branch that takes on the "Edo" concept. While the other branches have a strong Italian feel in the interiors, Ramen Due Edo Japan feels more natural and rustic because of its focus on wood.

Due Italian/Ramen Due Edo Japan's most sought-after specialty, Ramen Ham Fromage is perhaps the best illustration of Japanese and Italian fusion. The soup, made with tasty chicken broth, has the perfect chemistry with the creamy

cheese blend made with cheddar and gorgonzola. Another must-try is the original Foie Gras Miso Ramen, where the rich delicate taste of foie gras goes very well with the robust flavor of the soup.

n June 2018, digital art collective teamLab together with Mori Building launched "Mori Building Digital Art Museum: teamLab Borderless," the collective's first permanent exhibition in Tokyo, which aims to transcend boundaries between artworks, art and people, and oneself and others. Like a galaxy contained in a 10,000-square-meter building, the museum consists of different worlds with no boundaries, each world transitioning seamlessly as you step into the next. In total, there are around 50 digital artworks to experience within the five zones.

In the Borderless World, flowers bloom at your feet, elephants and lions live as floral creatures, and lights dance around you. People challenge themselves at Athletics Forest, where play areas are three-dimensional, galactic, and colorful. The Future Park meanwhile is where ocean creatures are brought to life by children who draw them and where playful little people move on tables and walls.

In the Forest of Lamps, as you stand still close to a lamp, light spreads through the nearby lamps, a different color each time. The more people there are in the room, the more colorful and magical it becomes. Lastly, the EN Tea House shows that even gastronomy can be digitized and integrated with digital art. You can get a glimpse of the universe in your tea cup, where lights seem to have a life of their own. The tea house serves hot and cold teas at ¥500.

Another shop is **Imo Tako**, which puts in a generous amount of a variety of ingredients for their takoyaki. Besides the meaty chunks of octopus, they also put dried ebi, green onions and ginger. Imo Tako's takoyaki is soft and creamy inside out, and while there are more ingredients, the taste is slightly lighter than Yamachan, whose flavors are heavily packed in the batter.

Started by a small businessman 50 years ago, Daily Chico is now a staple at Nakano. The main crowd puller is the Tokudai Soft Cream, a towering soft serve made with layers of soda pop, green tea, Muscat grape, chocolate, vanilla, coffee milk, strawberry, and dessert cheese. It is served together with a mini spoon, and you have to lightly scoop from the bottom up, so you can also enjoy the unique combination of

flavors. If you got your eyes on one flavor, just scoop gently sideward. You can also aim for certain flavors and get a small serving (¥280/1-3 flavors) or a medium serving (¥380/2-4 flavors).

All of the dishes are "kawaii" (Japanese for cute) and snapping a photo always precedes getting a bite—everything is just picture-perfect! One of the best-selling dishes is Pikachu's Variety Plate which is overloaded with Pikachu cuteness. For dessert and refreshment, swim in the Lapras' Marine Wave Parfait or get a zing from Gengar's Confuse Ray Smoothie served in a glass with Gengar's notorious grin.

On each table, there is a tablet computer used to place your order. These tablets can be switched to English, and you can easily browse through the list of menu items with photos.

stablished in 1987 in Nakano Broadway, Mandarake is one of the longest-standing and largest anime and manga stores in the whole world. It currently has 32 stores, which occupy most of the 2nd, 3rd, and 4th floors of Nakano Broadway (there is one store on 1F- Mon which displays Mandarake's featured products and auction items).

Housing a melange of stores, 2F gives a good jumpstart to your shopping spree. There are a lot of collectible toys, new and retro video games and consoles, DVDs, Blu-ray, and CDs of movies and animes, and more. Manga lovers should head straight to 3F, where there are two Honten sections with large collections of various manga, anime magazines, and artbooks. Meanwhile, on 4F is where you can find a lot of vintage items, from toys to comics and magazines. onveniently located on the basement of Tokyo Station, **Tokyo Character Street** is the perfect destination for fans of anime, manga, and other cute Japanese characters. Some of the hottest stores are the world-famous Pokémon Store, Hello Kitty Shop, and Rilakkuma Store, as well as Jump Shop, where you can find various characters of manga serialized in Weekly Shonen Jump like One Piece and Naruto. For Studio Ghibli fans, there is Donguri Republic which seems to be dominated by people's best-loved Totoro.

After shopping, fill yourself up at **Tokyo Ramen Sreet** which is just a short walk from Tokyo Character Street. It consists of eight ramen shops with their own various specialties. The diners that flock to Tokyo Ramen Street are diverse—Japanese businessmen, young people and foreign tourists, some still with their luggage.

You have to use a ticket machine to select your order and get a food ticket. Most of the ticket machines are in Japanese but each menu item is accompanied by a photo so you can pretty much get an idea of what you could get and what each dish is made of. One of the shops, Soranoiro, is a great choice for the health-conscious. If healthy were an actual taste, it would be their Veggie Soba, which is made with different vegetables from broth to noodles.




Sun Valley Golf Club

Touted as one of the best in the country, Sun Valley Golf Club is a public 18-hole, 72-par golf course with additional three holes that serve as a practice venue for a proposed golf academy. Situated in the mountainous terrain of Antipolo, it also offers some of the best views while playing a round of golf.

The terrain at Sun Valley can be challenging even to most experienced golfers. Tricky putts and fairways are in store for anyone who goes to try a round at the golf club. If you're not keen on taking your talent to the course, you can also take advantage of Sun Valley Golf Club's driving range and practice putting greens. They also have tee houses, locker rooms, function rooms, a restaurant, and an infinity pool at Sun Valley Clubhouse, where you can enjoy panoramic views of the course form the view deck.

Rates are at P1,200 for 18 holes on weekdays and P2,000 on weekends and holidays. There is a mandatory golf cart fee of P800 and a caddy fee of P400.



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Pinto Art Museum

Opened in 2010, Pinto Art Museum houses the private collection of Dr. Joven Cuanang and is dedicated to exhibiting and studying Philippine contemporary art. Dr. Cuanang began collecting to support the careers of artists from the group The Salingpusa. Over the years, his collection grew and has amassed works from subsequent generation of artists, many of which work in the figurative tradition. His collection now numbers around 200 sculptures, paintings, and installations.

The building itself is architecturally charming-its clean white structure and exterior stairs are reminiscent of Greek architecture. The museum is situated in the Silangan Gardens, a two-hectare garden complex that is home to birds and local fauna.

Pinto Art Museum is open from 9 am to 6 pm, from Tuesday to Sunday. Entrance fee is P200 for adults and P100 for students.





Avilon Zoo

When in Antipolo, Avilon Zoo would make a good side trip especially for families and animal lovers. Spanning 7.5 hectares, Avilon Zoo is the largest zoological institution in the Philippines. More than 3,000 live specimens of over 500 species of exotic wildlife call it home. Thanks to the zoo's conservation programs, most of the fauna have been bred successfully in captivity. Some of the crowd favorites are the lions, Philippine falconet, spotted hyenas, and Rothschild's giraffes. It also houses a diverse collection of plants, about half of which are native to the Philippines.

It is ideal to go here from Antipolo City when you bring your own vehicle. Avilon Zoo is open from 8 am to 5 pm every day. The entrance fee is P700 for adults and P400 for children 3 feet and below.


Casa Santa

ess than an hour away from Antipolo City lies Masungi Georeserve. Climbing its many peaks, one can feel just how insignificant humans are compared to Mother Nature, putting more gravity in the lessons that this georeserve hopes to pass. There are 3 trails to experience. The original trail called the Discovery Trail, defined by sharp rock formations and numerous peaks, is home to more than a dozen flora and fauna with more to be discovered. Adrenaline junkies will enjoy the famous Sapot (Spiderweb) with stunning views of Sierra Madre and Laguna de Bay, as well as the many rope bridges and the 84-foot drop via cargo net. Night Trail guests may have a higher chance of encountering animals in the georeserve since many of them are nocturnal.

The newest **Legacy Trail** lets you experience the day-to-day conservation efforts as you participate in tree planting and other nurturing activities. For each group that visits Masungi, a tree is planted in their honor at the Legacy Trail.

After a 3-4 hour hike, **Silayan Dining Room** awaits on top of a hill for an unforgettable dining experience. Under Chef Ezekiel Macadangdang, the restaurant offers food both familiar and new, made from ingredients sourced from the georeserve or independent farmers. 

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History

It was in October, year 1810, when a wedding in Munich, Southern Germany, was so richly celebrated it transcended all other festivities in the kingdom.

That the weather teases of winter's approach did not hinder the Crown Prince Ludwig of Bavaria and Princess Therese of Saxony-Hildburghausen from inviting the whole citizenry of Bavaria to celebrate their royal matrimony at an open field called the Theresienwiese in Munich. 14 humongous tents peppered the field, with the biggest tent housing over 10,000 people! A band and a brewery, exclusive only to Munich, graced each tent, serving entertainment accompanied by great beers to those in attendance. Meanwhile, outside was a fun fare of horse races and cross-bow competitions, witnessed by all and sundry.

Fueled as the celebration was by German beer made only with malt, hops, and water to heed the king's orders, no warmth given by these drinks could ever extinguish the cold of October, which created put the tradition in a quandary. Compelled by the citizens' plea to continue the celebration year after year on a weather much more forgiving than October's, it was only in the last 50 years that Oktoberfest was pushed back to mid-September until the 1st Sunday of October, in time for what the Germans call an "Old Wives' summer," attended by over six million people each year!



Oktoberfest in the Philippines

Fueled by authentic German beer, fired up by camaraderie, and inflamed by long-standing royal traditions from Bavaria, Oktoberfest seemed to have travelled from the city of Munich to different parts of the world, including Manila whose longest-running Oktoberfest celebration is attributed to German Club Manila.

Celebrating its 113th anniversary in January 2019, German Club Manila is one of the oldest clubs catering to the expats in the Philippines. 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

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Business Talk An interview with the top executives in the Philippines Get a first person point of view when it comes to business



Antonio A. Turalba, Sr. is the founder and chairman of the Active Group of Companies. He holds a degree in Architecture from the University of the Philippines and placed fifth in the 1970 licensure examination for architects.

He is a noted environmental planner, holding the distinction of being the first private sector representative to the Housing and Urban Development Coordinating Council (HUDCC) in 1978. He is a recipient of the U.P. Alumni Association Award in Architecture (1989) and was named "Outstanding Professional in Architecture" by the Professional Regulatory Commission (PRC) in 1996. He is also Fellow of the United Architects of the Philippines, the country's leading association for architects, and is a past president for the Chamber of Real Estate Brokers Associations (CREBA) and Rotary Club of Makati East.

How long have you been involved in real estate? How did you get into architecture?

I've been in real estate for 48 years, with our 50th anniversary coming up in 2020. Initially, the University of the Philippines (UP) College of Architecture used to be a part of the UP College of Engineering, alongside Civil Engineering. With that exposure, I pursued a degree in architecture. As far as business goes, I've been in business since I was 13 years old. I've been involved in many kinds of businesses like buy and sell.

What separates the Active Group of Companies from other real estate developers in the country?

I think what separates us is our experience. If you look at the competition, we've lasted longer than any of them. The Active Group was started by me and my

I've been in business since I was 13, received a degree in Architecture, and have received many awards through the course of my career, especially from the university (UP) and regulatory commission (PRC). These already separate me and my company from other businesses.

Some businessmen hire architects, while others hire

business consultants. They might hire those with postgraduate degrees (Master's degree and PhD holders), but I have the option of not doing so. I've been exposed to both sides (architecture and business) that even if I do hire someone, I can still share my experience with them and guide them in improving our business.

Tell us more about Mount Malarayat Golf and Country Club.

We came up with that project because of the qualities of the site. When we were offered the property, we saw its potential as a golf course. The cool climate and topography made it ideal for golf. The quality of the soil and the constant source of water made it easy to maintain, and the breathtaking backdrop of Mount Malarayat made it all the more special. Being architects, we took full advantage of what the site had, and, as a businessman, I converted it into a business venture.

The way you see it now in terms of natural beauty, it reflects how it came about from the get-go. It shows how it has been managed from the beginning. We did not need to do any major interventions or alter the landscape in any way; all we did was work with what nature had provided and improve on it.

It is also a testament to how we run the business. Imagine how much the landscaping, specifically the plants, cost our company; that money can already go towards building another golf course!

We're proud to call Malarayat "the first all-weather course in the country." Other courses that came after us may claim to be all-weather courses, but Malarayat was the first. You can play even after a heavy downpour, and it has been proven. We invested in the well-constructed drainage system that lies beneath the course, which has made this possible. The result is that members and guests can play on the course in mere minutes after a downpour. Walking on the course after the rain will not leave a single patch of mud on your shoes.

We have even issued a challenge to anyone who plays at Malarayat. We will waive your green fees if you play and get mud in your shoes after it rains on our course. This challenge still stands to this day, and it hasn't been taken advantage of since.

What were some of the challenges you faced while developing Mount Malarayat?

We didn't have any partners for Mount Malarayat Golf and Country Club. It was a joint venture, but there were no major partners for the development of the course. We've had to finance that project using our own resources. There were still other variables to consider like the design, but having to fund the development by ourselves proved to be the biggest challenge.

We were also hit by the Asian Financial Crisis in 1997. We were almost done with construction when that happened. We formally opened the golf course in 1998 even as we faced the tail end of the financial crisis. To have Malarayat be the way it is now was the biggest challenge we've ever faced.

What challenges are you facing as the Active Group Chairman?

Being the chairman is challenging in itself. You have to come up with the direction of the entire group. You also have to make sure that everybody is happy, as well as ensure that the company goes on even after I'm

What are your plans for Mount Malarayat Golf Active Group for the foreseeable future?

The Active Group has a big project that it will be taking on within the next two years. Our 50th anniversary is just around the corner and we're looking to celebrate it with something big. We can't say much, but we're preparing for that right now.

Malarayat, on the other hand, will be celebrating its 20th year and we're preparing activities for both members and guests this October. It's a way for us to show guests that we're still the best course in the country and that they are assured of having the best, even if it is for a price. We want to continue to deliver a quality of life that goes beyond shelter and beyond golf.

How would you describe the way you manage the Active Group of Companies?

Each of our companies may have its own head, but I still check in from time to time as the chairman of the Active Group. I always keep my guard up.

I also made sure that my children will be exposed to the company at a young age. Most of them are already involved in real estate. Only one of my children, my youngest, didn't follow in my footsteps, and is now a physician in the United States. They're also supported by some of the best and most experienced people I know. I want to make sure that the quality of our work remains at its highest level even without me being directly involved.

What moment has made the biggest impact in your career as an architect and businessman?

The most memorable, by far, is where the company is right now. At this point, we're practically debt-free. To me, that is the biggest. We've been through many ups and downs. We've faced three global financial crises in the history of our company.

The way I've looked at things and how I achieved what I have has been through hard work and focus. The most important things for me have always been honesty, integrity, dedication, and sincerity. These are the things that will help you sell. People will know who you are and will only lend you something if you have these qualities. That's how I grew myself and the Active Group to what it is today. My friends have helped me along the way because of my integrity.

If your clients see how sincere you are in doing your job, you will survive. We do not want to lose face if we don't deliver on our promises, something that's very Japanese.

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Business Talk Extended Interview with the top executives of Japanese Companies that have penetrated the Philippine market



"Kato joins forces with local partners to undertake regional development in Mindanao island."

Born in Tokyo in 1974, Satoshi Kato graduated from Waseda University and joined a major educational material publisher, Obunsha Group, in 1997. In 2004, he joined Australia's biggest investment bank, Macquarie Group, then in 2009, he joined Chodai Co., Ltd

He holds an MBA, Master of Economics, and Ph.D. in Regional Development Studies.

He is the President of Chodai Philippines Corporation as well as General Manager of Finance & Legal Division, Corporate Planning Group of Chodai Co., Ltd.

While celebrating their 50th anniversary this year, Chodai partnered with Equi-Parco Construction Company among others, to develop a hydro power plant in Caraga region of Mindanao, and oversaw completion of construction in May 2018. Chodai is now focusing on economic development under a private-sector initiative to create employment in Mindanao through over 10 projects in a wide range, from infrastructure, agriculture and aquaculture, to industrial parks. And, Satoshi Kato is the one who has been managing these projects right from the start, back in 2011.

You joined Chodai in 2009. When did you first come to the Philippines?

It was September 2011. I was taking a postgraduate university course at the time, and coming to the Philippines to conduct a field study was part of the course. The course itself was designed for business people specializing in PPP (Public-Private-Partnership). One of their lectures included a "PPP Project" which involved choosing one municipality and studying their methods of problem-solving and economic development or revitalization through PPP. Then, Butuan City in Mindanao was chosen as the municipality to study in the second semester 2011 of the lecture.

Mindanao was where you started?

That's right. Butuan city appears in a Japanese business novel, "炎熱商人" (Ennetsu Shonin) published in 1982 by Yusuke Fukada, and the city once thrived with forestry, exporting timber to a number of countries including Japan. But the timber industry fell into decline, and shrimp farming began to develop in its place. It quickly became the main industry of the area, but in the late '90s, due to repeated cultivation and disease, this also fell into decline. After that, with the help of JICA (Japan International Cooperation Agency) and ODA (Official Development Assistance), construction became the main industry. But, ODA projects do not last forever.

So the city needed a new industry?

Well, Butuan lies in northeastern Mindanao, a central city of Caraga region. There are several colleges and universities, so it needed, and still needs, new industries to provide employment for the development of the region. Our partner, Equi-Parco, is headquartered in Butuan, and one of its founders, the COO at that time and now the mayor of Butuan, Mr. Lagnada, was worried about Butuan's future. He was concerned that there was nowhere continuously creating employment that would attract talented workers and convince them to stay in the region, which is vital for regional development.

Your first visit to Butuan was during the Aquino administration, is that right?

That's correct; "Financial Reform" and "Anti-Corruption" were the main slogans at that time, and they lead to the Philippines being rated, for the first time in its history, as an investment grade country by three major credit rating agencies. This was obviously a good sign; however, for financial reform, the budget for public investment needed to be repressed, while infrastructure is a substantial basis for the development of the economy. Therefore, to accommodate both financial reform and infrastructure development simultaneously, the Aquino administration took PPP seriously. Because budgets were limited, they had to bring in money and know-how from the private sectors by using PPP, and then develop the necessary infrastructure rapidly and extensively.

How did Butuan get involved in the project?

President Duterte, a previous mayor of Davao City in Mindanao, has overseen a change in the situation of Mindanao in the sense that more people are paying a closer interest to the region, and yet, the priority for public investment was first Manila, then Cebu, and finally Mindanao at that time. And so, things were not likely to change if they just wait and hope for the best. So, Mr. Lagnada came up with an idea, "Why don't we use PPP to develop Butuan?" He started to seek some advice, and reached out to Toyo University, the only graduate school in the world with a master course specializing in PPP. From that moment, Toyo University began their study, and I was lucky enough to come to Butuan as one of the team members in September 2011.

From that research, how did Chodai come to be

As to the PPP study, a report was drawn up and submitted, and then everything was finished as a series of lectures. However, we were allowed to utilize the report for business, or for anything we wished.

Meanwhile, Chodai was looking at ways to explore new business opportunities domestically and internationally, and hydro power business in Asian countries was one of the main targets. The reason for this was that 60 to 70 percent of the total project cost relates to civil engineering works, which is Chodai's strong point, so we were able to utilize our workers, engineering skills, years of experience, and so on. During the study, I heard that Equi-Parco was planning to move into the hydro power business for the first time, and then, as soon as I returned to Japan from the PPP research, I spoke to my colleague in charge of new business development. The following month, I revisited Butuan, this time as an employee of Chodai, no longer as a graduate student.

These days, we are seeing wide expansions in other businesses, not only hydro power, including: renewable energy such as wind and biomass; basic infrastructures such as water supply; primary industries such as farming, aquaculture; and development and management of industrial parks. These are all managed as private businesses, and through equity investment, Chodai is hoping to contribute to them on a long-term basis.

What are your plans and dreams for the future?

Our company name, "Chodai," comes from the Japanese "長大橋" (Chodai-Kyo), which means "long and large bridge," as we started out as a bridge design company. Bridges are something that connects "people to people" and "region to region," or "now and the future." In this way, through our ongoing business, I hope to be someone who connects Japan and the Philippines, and Japan and Mindanao while contributing to the economic development of Mindanao, as well as the Philippines.

What role does Chodai Philippines Corp. play?

Please tell us about your projects in Mindanao.


