

Getting to Mckinley Hill


McKinley Hill is accessible via major roads coming from both the north and the south such as C-5 Road and Lawton Road. P2P buses also serve Mckinley Hill.

By bus, those coming from Makati and nearby can take the P2P Bus from San Lorenzo Place Terminal in Magallanes for P25. Trips run from 6 am to 12 am.

From BGC, Venice Grand Canal mall is a 15-minute walk south of Mckinley Parkway Bus Stop.

Parking

There are many parking areas in and around Mckinley Hill. Mckinley Parking Building, Venice Luxury, and Area 7 are open 24/7. Rates for the first three hours range from P30 to P50. For more information, you may call McKinley Hill's Administration Office at 02-798-0917.

15 land Hopping

Not known to many, Bohol harbors many beautiful beaches not only on the mainland but also on the many pristine islets that surround it. One way to explore a number of these beaches is through an island hopping tour.



One of the islands usually included in island hopping tours is Balicasag Island, a 40-minute boat ride from Alona Beach. Divers and snorkelers are a common sight in the waters of Balicasag Island as the marine life is extraordinary. You may choose to have lunch on the island; bring or buy your own ingredients and have them cooked on the island through a local custom called paluto, which costs around P300.



On Virgin Island, you will find a one-hectare sandbar that will make you feel you're in paradise. It's the perfect spot for your Instagram beach photos. You can also walk in the shallow beach and admire the crystal clear waters where you might find colorful starfish.



Another highlight of any island tour is Panglao Island itself, where you can have the chance to meet friendly and energetic dolphins. This activity is usually the first in the tour as it is easiest to spot the dolphins early in the morning when the water is cool. Be sure to get up early as there is a greater chance of seeing the dolphins between 5 am and 6:30 am.



Chocolate Hills PP

To get a good view of Chocolate Hills, you need to go up a flight of stairs that lead to a viewing deck 210 feet above ground. The hills are actually covered by grass, which gives it a green color in the wet season. During the dry season, especially from late November to May, the grass dries up and gives the hills their trademark chocolate color.

Just six minutes from the Chocolate Hills viewing deck is Chocolate Hills Adventure Park (CHAP), which opened in 2014 for adventure-seekers. "The Rush" (P450), a 150-foot high bicycle zipline spanning 550 meters between two hills, is prominent among tourists. Other popular activities are the rope courses and rope climbing.

Tarsier Conservation

Bohol Tarsier is one of the few tarsier conservation areas certified by the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) to take care of the rare Philippine tarsiers. A total of eight tarsiers can be seen at Bohol Tarsier, with others placed under captive breeding. They usually hang out in the trees, and



visitors are asked to tone any noise down as tarsiers are usually asleep during daytime. There is also a gift shop with all kinds of souvenirs, such as tarsier keychains, hats, wallets, and native bags made from palm leaves.

Minagdanan Cave

Hinagdanan Cave takes its name from the Cebuano word "hinagdanan," which translates to "laddered." The farmer who first made the discovery made a ladder to access the cave; now there are concrete steps that, although steep, lead visitors more easily into the cave. Inside the cave, there are stalagmites, one of the features the cave is most known for.

There is also a small saltwater lagoon for swimming.

Immaculate Conception Church of Baclayon, known simply as Baclayon Church, is one of Bohol's most sacred treasures of all time. The church's roots can be traced back to The church's roots can be traced back to 1596, when it was established by Spanish Jesuit priests. Its coral stone structure was completed in 1727. With these, Baclayon Church should be an indispensable part of every tour, especially for those interested in history and culture. A tour starts from its museum and usually ends at the gift shop where you can get unique memorabilia.





Blood Compact Shrine

Sandugo or blood compact is the traditional equivalent of diplomatic relations. The blood compact between Datu Sikatuna of Bohol and Spanish General Miguel Lopez de Legaspi, who was on an expedition from Navidad, Mexico in 1565, is considered a significant event in Bohol's history. This event is immortalized in a bronze sculpture by a Boholano National Artist, the late Napoleon V. Abueva, located beside Ocean Suites Boutique Hotel.

Business Talk

An interview with the top executives in the Philippines Get a first person point of view when it comes to business



Ryan K. Cruz is the man behind three famed Japanese restaurants in Metro Manila, namely, Ramen Yushoken, Mendokoro Ramenba, and Kazunori. A graduate of marketing management from De La Salle University, Cruz had a string of businesses including venturing into gaming and amusement but found his true passion in the food industry.

How did you get into the restaurant business?

The food industry is something that I've always wanted to get into. Even though I graduated with a marketing management degree, I still pushed myself to go to culinary school when I was already doing business. There was a ramen restaurant in Makati that my friends used to frequent, and the idea came to me during one of those times I tried it. For me, there was a disconnect between the line of customers and what I was eating. So, I was telling myself, "Why are people lining up for this?"

I usually don't talk about it this way because it might seem pompous or arrogant, and I try to avoid that. But it's the truth. I saw that there has to be a huge opportunity here if people were lining up for this, knowing that there was so much better stuff out there. The big lesson here is that you have to always strive to have higher standards than everyone else if you want to stand out in the industry. It's the same standard that presents opportunities for you as well.

In one of my early trips to Japan, I decided to do some sort of a ramen tour. It was an eye-opening experience because the level of education, understanding, and respect for food in Japan is very different from what it is here. That level of appreciation interests and excites me

When was the time that you realized that you actually want to do a restaurant business?

I always knew that it was one of the riskiest businesses one could get into; the attrition rate locally was no different from the rest of the world, about 72%. I only took it seriously when I met these ramen chefs and saw what they could do. My previous businesses were all very different. I was into micro-financing, gaming, and amusement, but those were not really industries that I was passionate about, to be completely honest. This right now is something that has proven to be what I really love doing.

It's such a rewarding experience when you know you made a difference in people's lives and you sort of become a fabric in their lifestyle already. One example is when people would come up to me and introduce me to their one-year-old son or daughter and they tell me, "You know, this guy grew up on ramen," because the whole time that the mother was pregnant, they would go to our place. Or when they say how they've had such a stressful day and they look forward to eating your food to waste that all away.

What do you think should go into creating a restaurant that has good food, good quality, and a good following?

First of all, you always have to think about the purity of intention. When I say that, it's thinking, "What kind of product will I have on the market if I didn't consider the cost and the possible income?" You start from that and develop the product. It was making sure that the intention was translated into an experience for our customers over and over again. The next thing you have to remember is, "What is the overall retail experience that I want my customers to go through?" That is something that has to involve both the front and back of the house. Always remember also that every single thing in the restaurant sends a message.

It's really spending so much time in this business that has allowed me to learn a lot of what is required to run an operation like this. In the end, you need to have the absolute passion for it. If you don't, you will end up quitting way before you are able to give what is required of you.

Can you differentiate between Mendokoro, Kazunori, and Yushoken?

Yushoken and Mendokoro are both ramen restaurants; they are essentially the same. Yushoken is a full service restaurant with typical chairs and tables. Mendokoro has a full bar format, and it actually translates to "A place where you share ramen." The whole idea was to cut the distance between the kitchen and the customer, as temperature plays such a huge role in the enjoyment of the dish. Other than that, it has the fried rice and the karaage like Yushoken has.

Kazunori is a three-in-one concept where you have a café, the main restaurant, and the sushi bar. The café menu are the things you would have in a Tokyo café, where there is a cross between Japanese and French, or Italian, or American cuisines. The restaurant concentrates on more traditional things, like the yakitori, the udon, the soba—more refined, structured things I would say. And then the sushi bar being our crown jewel is our main specialty, and we offer Omakase courses nightly, aside from our a la carte items.

What can you say about the local dining market?

I think they are a lot more educated nowadays. Now, the part of the dining scene is becoming an enjoyable cerebral exercise. If you were drinking wine, you start thinking what's the grape variety, what kind of temperature or soil makeup does the grapes grow from, etc-food has become that. However, I still think that for a lot of types of cuisines though, we're still not there yet in terms of full appreciation. Back in the '80s, it was a little more difficult because you mostly had nothing but fine dining and fast food. There was hardly anything in between. It was in the mid to late '90s, when that started changing and it's fantastic because food became more accessible. Nowadays, people are learning a lot through social media and the internet as a whole. It can only get better. Great restaurants ultimately are good for the industry itself. It is through them that the market gets educated. They prove that it's worth it to make an effort to go out, spend money for an experience that you would want to keep repeating again and again.

How would you describe your management style?

My management style is something that is constantly evolving. I came from being someone who's very hands-on—but when your company grows, micromanaging is never good because it shows that you don't trust your people. And the whole premise of hiring people who specialize in one thing, like a restaurant manager or an HR manager, is because they're supposed to know better than you. So now that I have them, it's my job to manage and guide them. And I owe it to my partners and the business itself to focus on growing it. Up to this day though, still handle customer complaints by myself because there will always be customers who will only be satisfied if they're talking to the owner. And that's something that I tell my staff, that we're all in this together. If you make a mistake and screw up, you have me to back you up. Lastly, and this is something that I wish everyone would practice, is that I treat all my employees like family. If you don't want your customer to be treated like a commodity, then don't treat your employees like a commodity

Business Talk Extended Interview with the top executives of Japanese companies that have penetrated the Philippine market



Osamu Motonaga became the President of Mirai Philippines Corp. in 2018. He has a diverse business background, which includes buying and selling clothes at a children's apparel company. Starting new lines of business in Mirai Philippines Corp., Motonaga is now expanding to manufacture customized packaging products. For the sake of global launch, Motonaga competes in a niche market.

Please tell us about yourself after graduating from university.

I joined an apparel company as a salesman. We mainly dealt with children's clothes, from reasonable to expensive. I worked for eight years, which included purchasing clothes, managing stocks, and shipping products. It was a good business experience for me.

When did you join Miraijushi (mother company of Mirai Philippines Corp.)?

I joined in 1992 when I turned 29. Getting married at 26 and having a baby made me feel inspired to change my career. I did not spend much time with my family while working at an apparel company, which was my main reason to change my job.

What is an attractive point of Miraijushi?

I felt a sense of familiarity because Miraijushi and my family business had the same clients. The business model of Miraijushi was attractive. It includes development of plastic products for

civil engineering materials and standardizing the items. Moreover, there was no packaging business yet.



And then you tapped the market in the Philippines.

As the Philippines has a strong potential to grow, we established a new company in August 2016, named Mirai Philippines Corp. Developing human resources here in the Philippines and making them lead our overseas operations is one of the reasons that we entered this market. We were not able to start the recycling business in Europe before because we did not have enough employees with good command of English.



How do you develop sales?

We clearly give enough details of the cost advantage of using our product to customers. Some clients were able to reduce logistics cost when they used our packing service. It is very important to go to the field, see the processes, and think about the challenges and how to solve them.

What is your principle in business?

Focusing on communication is very important. I would like to create a workplace where people with different characters respect one another.

What are the challenges Mirai Philippines Corp. have faced?

Developing human resources is so hard. Most of our clients are Japanese companies so they need Japanese quality and mentality, which are slightly different from that of the Philippines. We are planning to make our business manuals and disseminate them in our company.

What do you think are the advantages of doing business in the Philippines?






