




Alabang is also a place that inspires healthy living at no cost. Parks and open areas are a convenient go-to for fitness and outdoor enthusiasts. Cyclists come together at Filinvest Mountain Bike (MTB) Trail, while joggers have the freedom to set their course as nearly every trail and every road in Filinvest City are spacious and well-paved.

Further, tons of restaurants and establishments in Alabang are birthed from people's passion and unique stories. The best part is that these people strive to provide authenticity matched with a local touch for everyone to experience. Other options for public transportation are jeepneys and vans. Alabang South Station is the central station where you can find jeepneys serving Pasay, Bicutan, Sucat, Baclaran, and Zapote. Jeepneys also pass by different subdivisions such as Alabang Hills, Intercity Homes, and Hillsborough.

There are also vans bound for parts of Cavite and Laguna stationed at Alabang South Station, Festival Mall, and Alabang Town Center. Depending on your destination, fares range from P50 to P100.

Parking

Sufficient parking space is provided in malls like Alabang Town Center, Festival Mall, and Molito. The standard rate for the first 3 hours is P40, while overnight parking ranges from P500 to P600.

Operating for two decades already, Festival Mall is a one-stop recreational destination for all kinds of people. Its most popular facility is X-Site, a cyber playground home to the biggest indoor coaster ride in the country. Experience the heart-pounding roller coaster drop of the X-treme Coaster, the spin and thrills of X-plo Drive bump car, and the adrenaline rush of the Xyber Trax go kart!

Kids can also surely enjoy exploring the mall on The Rail, a train that goes around the lower ground floor. You can ride it with your kids at the Festival Grand Station located near the Food Junction. Meanwhile, the newest feature is River Park, its centerpiece a creek surrounded by lush gardens and dining options. This romantic landscape is best experienced at night when it is lit up by colorful lights.








MOLITO




Ramen Yushoken PPP

He finished his pre-medical degree at the University of Sto. Tomas. He took his MD at the Fatima College of Medicine, had his internship at Jose R. Reyes Memorial Medical Center, and completed his residency training at the Department of Orthopedics in the same institute. His approach to treating patients is somewhat unique. He earns the patients' trust by thoroughly explaining to them their conditions, possible treatment options, and expectations during their recovery in the simplest interpretation possible by layman's terms. He has been practicing as an active fellow of the Philippine Orthopedic Association for the past 17 years.







Business Talk

An interview with the top executives in the Philippines Get a first person point of view when it comes to business



Ernani Omar Cruz is the founder and CEO of Stash, a healthcare management system. He has experience in the industries of IT, finance, and airlines, working with large multinational companies. In 2015, Cruz was the only Filipino to get accepted into the Australian startup accelerator program, muru-D. With Cruz at the helm, Stash is on a mission to connect doctors, hospitals, insurance companies, and pave the way for a better healthcare system in the Philippines.

Can you tell us about your company and how it started?

Stash is a health technology company that aims to integrate and offer technology solutions in the healthcare industry. Currently, our focus is in claims management for hospitals and health insurance companies.

Back in 2013, I was working on an idea, "How can I make the doctor and patient interaction faster, more efficient?" Right now, we are still paper-based; when you go to the doctor, the doctor sees you, writes on a paper, then the staff indexes it. This is inefficient and insecure. The initial idea was to provide an app for doctors and patients—somewhat like a practice management software. However, scalability was a challenge as doctors have different needs and with so many variables.

In 2015, I got into a 6-month program by muru-D Accelerator, a Telstra-backed accelerator program. There, we pivoted to a more strategic approach, which is catered to health institutions. We went from a B2C standpoint with doctors and clients to B2B with hospitals and the health insurance companies, HMOs, and PhilHealth for the most part.

How did you get into the industry?

I had been working as a technology head for a firm and we were working on a startup idea. In 2013, I was a new dad. Whenever we went to the doctor, the time we spent there was ridiculous.

When I was single and used to be active in sports, I got injuries and went to the hospital often. There was a doctor that made me wait for three hours and when he finally examined me, he told me to buy a pain reliever and charged me P800.

It made me think of the people who can't afford doctors, actually dying in wait for medical attention if we have this kind of practice. Coming from the IT industry, we are not used to waiting. There are fast transactions and connection so I saw the need to change. There are so many points in the healthcare industry, especially in the systems, that need solutions. For Stash, we want to impact a lot of people and we utilize technology to improve the lives of many.

How do you convince the hospitals, address the cynicism, and tell them that you are actually trying to help?

The first thing that we did was to get credibility. To convince them, there are mainly two parts: first, is we educate them on digital transformation; and second is we ride on what the government is pushing for. Now, PhilHealth will only pay claims that are sent digitally and since we are able to do that, it opened a lot of doors for us. We use multiple avenues to convince customers.

How big is your team now?

Currently, we are 15 but we started with only one, me. So far, most of the people here have been with us for three years, they've been with me since the start. They know what it's like and they know that this is bigger than us, the mission.

What sets us apart is our missional mindset and it is also being respectful of your roots, the purpose. Healthcare is really difficult in itself, so one of the things we try to avoid is internal conflict, losing our identity and why we do

things. We guard ferociously our core values like integrity, action, respect; things that could make or break a company.

What kind of people do you hire?

As a technology company, we put more people in the software and engineering department.

Do you have anyone with a medical background?

Yes. Mostly in the advisory role. We have eight advisors mostly based in Singapore. The one here is Dr. Ted Herbosa, former Undersecretary of the Department of Health and Noemi Azura, the CEO of Insular Health Care Inc., to name a few. We may not be doctors but we are surrounded by doctors. Our main focus is technology, so we have the freedom of seeing things in a way that people from the medical field may not understand.

What can you say about the healthcare industry in the Philippines? Do you have any data on healthcare for expats in the country?

It's getting better. I'm glad about the recent passage of UHC (Universal Health Care) law, the push of the government to modernize the healthcare system especially in claims processing (through e-claims). But I wish that the turnaround time of decision-making becomes faster.

How would you describe your management style?

It's mostly diplomatic as I like people to take ownership of what they do. I dislike micromanaging as that is inefficient. I believe that people work best on something if they can make full use of their own intellectual facilities. I tell the guys what we need to do, the big vision, and I let them do what needs to be done to get to the vision.

What book would you recommend to businessmen or aspiring entrepreneurs?

Zero to One by Peter Thiel. I think it drives the focus as a startup, what it is that really matters. There are a lot of killers of productivity so the founder needs to have a very small focus that needs to be something that will generate the business. If your focus is too spread out, with the limited resources, you will not be able to do anything.




