


- The first Japanese immigration in the Philippines was recorded as early as the 12th century.
- The Japanese are the third largest majority of foreign citizens in the Philippines, following the US and China (as of 2010 census) and also one of the country's biggest tourism markets.

#### TIPS

- Many of the restaurants in and around Little Tokyo have their own smoking areas. There is a small area inside Little Tokyo itself for smoking; but outside, it is prohibited.
- It is best to bring cash as not all restaurants accept credit
- The best time to go to Little Tokyo is in the evening to enjoy the ambiance made dramatic by Japanese lanterns. It is also the time when the area fully comes to life.
- You can walk from Greenbelt or Legaspi Park area to Little Tokyo in less than 15 minutes.
- Nearby parking areas are in Makati Central Square, Creekside, and Legaspi Car Park.

apanese communities outside of Japan are commonly called Japantown, serving as a piece of refuge for the Japanese yearning for home. Some of them are also named J-Town, Little Tokyo, and Nihonmachi. In the Philippines, there are six known Japanese communities, which are in Manila, Makati, Iloilo, Cebu, Davao, and Mandaue; and the one in Makati is called Little Tokyo.

Little Tokyo in Makati lit its lanterns in 1999 and has since been welcoming both Japanese expats and Japanese food lovers alike. Welcoming visitors are two iconic torii gates, one on Fernando Street and the other on Chino Roces Avenue. Strictly speaking, Little Tokyo refers to the compound that you reach by entering one of the torii gates. However, through time, the community of Japanese restaurants have grown and sprouted up in the surrounding establishments such as Makati Central Square, Creekside, and Beacon Tower.



Little Tokyo is a small compound of Japanese restaurants bound by torii gates. You will only find these restaurants if you walk through the torii gate and follow the path lined with plants and lanterns. These restaurants are facing each other and have tables set up outside for those who would like to dine under the sky. Here are the best restaurants that represent the authentic taste of Little Tokyo.

#### RAMEN SHIMADA

You now have better reasons to slurp a hot bowl of ramen with their affordable and high-quality noodles, made memorable by its signature recipe. One of their crowd-favorites is the Yonaki Ramen, made with a delicious broth flavored with shoyu (Japanese soy sauce). The restaurant's chashu or braised pork belly also stars in the dish, topped with nori and other greens to complete the sumptuous ensemble. Other dishes on their menu include gyoza and tantanmen.



#### RIOZEN

Aside from serving Japanese hotpot, Riozen is also popular for its ramen and sashimi. This makes them an ideal dining stop for those looking for Japanese comfort food. Try their simmering Chanko Nabe with mixed vegetables and meat. Some of their dishes are also good for sharing, just like their best-selling Hakata Ramen.

#### OBMIHOLO

Oishinbo is a Japanese-style pub that lets you enjoy great food in the courtyard for when you'd like the nippy air cooling you off. #### OKONOMIYAKI KAGURA

Okonomiyaki Kagura has made a name for itself with its tasty Japanese pancakes, which are called okonomiyaki. Their okonomiyaki is available with different toppings to choose from such as pork, squid, octopus, shrimp, and cheese. The egg goes with the vegetables and your chosen toppings, before the mixture is fried on a hot pan. This thick pancake is then topped with sweet okonomiyaki sauce, mayonnaise, a generous drizzle of seaweed and bonito flakes. Every bite is a complex mix of crunchy and juicy, which will be hard to forget even after leaving Little Tokyo.



While popular for their Japanese salads, sushi rolls, sashimi, and grilled dishes, Hana is most famous for their takoyaki, made fresh with a rich batter and quality Japanese ingredients. You may also try their yakisoba, sizzling tofu, and set meals. Afterward, cool down with Japanese shaved ice or kakigori in peach, lemon, matcha, and strawberry flavors.

famed **Basco Lighthouse**, built in 2002. This six-story conical beacon of light serves not only as a seafarer's aid but also a visitor's platform to get unobstructed views of Basco town, Mount Iraya, and the surrounding rolling landscapes. One such landscape is Vayang Rolling Hills.

About a 10-minute drive from Naidi Hills, Vayang is home to cows and goats grazing as freely as your eyes can wander the scenery. The rolling hills face the West Philippine Sea and offer a glimpse of the nearby Itbayat and Sabtang islands. If you stand on the highest peak of the hills, you will easily catch a picturesque view of Mount Iraya to the east and Chadpidan Boulder Beach to the north. Going up the peak requires a careful trek as the path is close to the slopes and a little narrow.

Moving 15 minutes south from Vayang, you'll find a tropical paradise that is unlike any other. Setting foot on Valugan Boulder Beach, you will immediately notice smooth boulders with different sizes along the shore—a beautiful collaborative work of Mount Iraya through its past eruptions and the West Philippine Sea through its tides. This beach scenery is said to be a famous subject for photographers. Around, you'll find piled-up rocks made by

tourists, which you can try yourself, but be very

careful as the waves can get very rough.


If you're familiar with Mount Gusuku in Okinawa, you'll find a similar one to the west of Valugan Boulder Beach, called Didawud Idjang. This famous geological formation, elevated approximately 100 meters above sea level, is made from molten volcanic magma and once served as a citadel and shelter for the locals during the war. Idjang Viewing is a nice viewing spot across Didawud Idjang to have a good view of the rock formation. From the drop-off point on National Road, you'll need to trek on steep slopes to reach the viewing point. Other spots to visit near the area are Dipnaysuhuan Japanese Tunnel, Mount Carmel Chapel (Tukon Church), and PAGASA Tukon Radar Station.

North Batan is best explored with Batanes Travel and Tours. Their experienced local tour guides will bring you to all the must-see places in Batanes, tell you the story of their land, and even give you a tip or two on where to eat, where to dive, and where to safely wander around by foot.

North Batan brims with very natural energy coming from its people, the capital's trading activities, and the airport that serves as the first nod of welcome for the island's visitors. Home to the provincial capital and center of commerce that is Basco, North Batan is the place where local livelihoods are cultivated and showcased in public markets, convenience stores, and souvenir shops. Although marked by vigor and modernity, the region still embodies the solemnity of Batanes as you drive away from the center and closer to the coast, as in Chanarian Beach where the shore is lovingly kissed by the tides.

The usual first stop upon arrival in Basco is the **Provincial Capitol**, a 3-minute drive from Basco Airport, where tourists need to settle the eco-tourism fee (P350/pax) and the DENR/PAMB fee (P50/pax). Adjacent to the building is the statue of Aman Dangat, a significant historical figure who fought for the rights and freedom of his people in Batanes.

The three most stunning spots in North Batan are Naidi Hill, Vayang Rolling Hills, and Valugan Boulder Beach, all unique coastal attractions that pull anyone into a paradise. Just a 15-minute walk northwest of the Provincial Capitol, **Naidi Hill** is the seat of the

These spots are included in the 4D3N full package tour of North and South Batan, and Sabtang by Batanes Travel & Tours starting at P5,500/pax for a group of 2 on a cogon tricycle (exclusive of hotel and ecotourism and DENR fees). It takes about 4-5 hours to tour North Batan alone. Van is also available for bigger groups.

While North Batan fosters community and livelihood, South Batan is the more poetic side of the island, a place where nature flourishes and standing amidst its rolling hills couldn't be more ethereal. The small communities that have made South Batan their home offer a glimpse of the modest daily lives of the Ivatans. Cows and carabaos live the dream life as they roam freely on vast pasturelands with the freshest air and best views-proof of how beautifully rustic Batanes is.

South Batan harbors its own iconic watchtower, built in 2002 on top of a hill, watching over the Pacific. As you tread your way to Tayid Lighthouse, you'll be bound by the views of the mountains to your right, the hedgerows to your left, and the lighthouse and the ocean ahead of you-then you might wonder if somehow you have reached Middle-Earth (The Lord of the Rings). Although currently not operational, Tayid Lighthouse still holds tourists' interests with its unique hexagonal shape. You may also view Tayid Lighthouse from Marlboro Country, located to the southeast.

Locally known as Rakuh a Payaman, Marlboro Country is a mesmerizing, visually boundless

landscape that rivals anything you have seen from movies. More than a paradise in Batanes, it is a large communal pastureland for cows and carabaos. You can also get a wide view of the landscape if you take the narrow path past Marconine's Canteen on National Road in Mahatao.

Also along the southeastern coast is a small village called Diura Fishing Village that showcases the simple yet abundant life of the Ivatan boatmakers and fishermen and their beautifully preserved age-old traditions.

There are fishing boats called tataya and faluwa (big boats) docked on the beach, a scene that calls for a nice snap or two. You may try riding the boats for a modest fee only when its owners are available to guide you.


Further south on the eastern coast is Motchong, a perfectly crisp and green viewpoint in Uyugan that looks out onto the Pacific Ocean. It is close to Alapad Pass, where the iconic "BLOW UR HORN" road sign can be found. It is also a quick drive to San Lorenzo Ruiz Chapel, one of the three churches, along with San Jose de Obrero Church in Ivana and San Carlos Borromeo Church in Mahatao, that

are usually part of one's tour in South Batan. It is important to note that, while each church welcomes everyone, you are expected to wear modest clothing as a show of respect to the sacred place.

Another special aspect of the cultural heritage of Batanes is its architecture. The Ivatans' resilience in the harshest conditions is best visualized by their ever-beautiful stone houses. One of the oldest and best preserved is House of Dakay in Ivana, constructed in 1887 and named after Jose "Dakay" Estrella to whom the house was dedicated by his aunt, Luisa Estrella. The stonehouse is unfurnished, but you can find a signage telling the history of the stone house inside.

Meanwhile, Honesty Coffee Shop, a 10-minute walk south of House of Dakay, is the reflection of the locals' pristine nature and the test of every visitors' honesty. Opened by an

old couple back in 1995, this unmanned shop has since served as a pitstop for people traveling to and from Sabtang. You get coffee or snacks as you please, list them on the logbook, and insert the total amount—or even more—into the dropbox for payment. They have souvenir items as well.















These spots along with other significant landmarks in South Batan are included in the 4D3N Batan and Sabtang Tour by Batanes Travel & Tours. It takes about 5-6 hours to tour South Batan.

These spots along with other places to visit in Mahatao, Uyugan, and Ivana are included in the 4D3N Batan and Sabtang Tour by Batanes Travel & Tours. The tour in Sabtang takes about 5-6 hours.









Sabtang Island is only 25 to 30 minutes away by boat from Batan, but many opt not to visit it because of the turbulent waters from the West Philippine Sea and Pacific Ocean. But this magnificent island is truly worth going the extra mile for, especially once you see the heritage villages holding centuries' worth of history. Most of the locals still follow traditional practices, keeping them delicately preserved despite the ever-changing times.

Chavayan Village is undoubtedly one of the most popular spots in Sabtang Island. Although a small community, the village has its own government to look over the people, and their primary means of living are agriculture and fishing.

Perhaps the most beautiful story you'll get from the village is how they craft their stone houses-made mostly from lime, a mixture of corals and lumber among other materials. There was no cement on the island until the Japanese era, so they creatively invented their own mixture. As for the roof, they use cogon, which requires changing every 25 to 30 years.

Tourists can also try wearing vakul, which is the headgear that Ivatans use to protect themselves from both the sun and the rain. Renting a vakul only costs P20.

Sharing the southeastern coast with Chavayan Village is Chamantad-Tinyan Viewpoint. The roads going here can be terrifying because of the steep road—even trekking it can scare you off-but what awaits you at the top is far beyond words. Imagine the vast Pacific Ocean sparkling through the horizon, as if the heavens are softly whispering that there's more for you to unravel.

Another village you should not miss visiting is Savidug, which, just like Chavayan Village, has a rich history featuring the early life of the Ivatans. The village used to be called Nabadichid, a place where the ancient tribal people held their funeral rituals. In the ritual, a dying person is placed over ditadit (edible green vines), and the locals eat the plant after they remove the dead. The nomadic tribespeople finally settled in Savidug, now known as a peaceful village in Sabtang. It is located along the hills, making it suitable for root crops and

Located on the northernmost tip of Sabtang is Morong Beach, which perfectly captivates the visitors of the island with its white-sand beach, calm atmosphere, and serenading waves. Another landmark you'll instantly notice is the Ahaw Arch made of limestone, which easily became a spot for picnickers.

There is a local eatery across the beach that serves authentic Ivatan dishes, called Paypanapanayan Canteen. A set meal good for two persons costs P700. It comes with luñis (Ivatan-style braised pork), sweet and sour fish, beef soup, vegetables, a platter of white and turmeric rice, and their famous bukayo (sweetened coconut). Eating lunch by Morong Beach is an incomparable experience, best enjoyed using your hands to eat (locally known as kamayan).

There are also churches in Sabtang Island, among which the most culturally significant is Sta. Rosa de Lima Chapel, which is the only church left with cogon grass roofing. Except for the facade, this church in Chavayan looks much like a traditional Ivatan home. A product of the early Ivatans' bayanihan (community spirit) or yaru, this beautiful chapel took almost eight years to construct—starting in 1951 and finally opening its doors in 1959.

A day trip to the island will end before you know it, as the last boat travels back to Batan at 1 pm. If you feel that one day isn't enough with so much to explore in Sabtang, there are no fancy hotels but rather homestays that offer modest accommodation to eager travelers.









#### **Vunong Dinette at** Jessica's Place

If there's one thing we want you to note when visiting Batanes, it is that you do not leave the province without visiting Vunong Dinette at Jessica's Place, a hidden gleaming gem in Basco. Inside, at the end of a garden path, you will find Jessica's home on the left and a simple, sophisticated dining setting on the right where her garage used to be.

They serve vunong, the Ivatan rice meal wrapped in kabaya (breadfruit leaves), similar to the Tagalog's binalot that uses banana leaves. You will be served with two leaf packets, one with turmeric rice and the other with the viands. The latter is comprised of uvud (meatballs mixed with banana tubers), Ivatan beef steak, luñis, and fried tanige (mackerel). This set meal is also served with beef or seafood soup and fern salad on the side.

It is best to eat Vunong bare-handed, but there are also utensils available. Vunong Dinette also strictly requires reservations so be sure to call them at least a day in advance. They also accept walk-ins for a minimum of 10 guests.

Business Talk

An interview with the top executives in the Philippines
Get a first person point of view when it comes to business



Ellard Capiral has developed trailblazing technologies and founded three startups in his career, including his latest, AdMov Marketing Solutions. His career—a mix of entrepreneurial and corporate—spans nearly two decades, beginning at a young age. Capiral aims for AdMov to lead in revolutionizing the advertising industry by integrating technology into the landscape.

#### Please talk about your experiences and background.

My journey started early on—AdMov is my third startup. My first, called Edge.Media, happened when I was a first-year student at the Asia Pacific College (APC). It was the generation of Nokia phones; if you wanted something like a picture message or ringtone on your phone, you have to text a keyword and the telco will send you the content. Edge.Media was the first web platform wherein you select what you want and it gets sent directly to your phone. I was able to sell that to Singtel (Singaporean telco).

I initially wanted to develop games. I took a bachelor's degree in computer science, information technology and systems software engineering. After studying games, I found that they are more on the artistic side, and I'm more on the logical side. That is why I ventured into software programming and application development.

I went into an internship in Trend Micro where I spent nine years before I started my second startup, MyGrocery.ph. It was the first online grocery platform, and it was too early. In 2011 to 2012, e-commerce was just starting to take off in other countries but not in the Philippines, so I had to close it after six months and went back to corporate. I became the Chief Technology Officer of CloudSwyft because I wanted to maximize my knowledge and experience in starting a company, and the best way is to join a different startup so you know how it happens from there.

Afterward, that's the time I started AdMov around the end of 2016.

#### Can you tell us about AdMov Marketing Solutions and its services? When and how did it start?

The idea came about because of my child. He always rides at the backseat of the vehicle and he watches videos on his iPad but it was hard on his arms. I mounted it on the headrest of the vehicle, then I noticed he began to enjoy traveling, so I thought other people may also appreciate it. It hit me as well that roadside billboards and advertisements are too far, small, or concise because motorists only have 2 to 4 seconds to see it.

The initial roll-out of the product was just a video loop but now that we introduced the Al and the facial recognition feature, the contents of the video are now more personalized and hyper-targeted to each passenger inside the vehicle. We analyze your age, gender, mood. It can play happy videos if the viewer is sad.

#### What separates your company from others with similar services?

Aside from the personalization of contents, in terms of company structure, ours is heavy on devs and technology, learning in the advertising industry. We are bringing this technical knowledge to change the advertising landscape. We don't have biases so we are free to implement what we think is possible.

#### What are the challenges you have encountered and how did you deal with them?

Our platform is a mix of out-of-home and digital. Some companies have divided marketing groups: digital, out-of-home, TV, radio, print. When we approach them, they don't know who in their team should talk to us. Some of the clients don't know that we are the solution to their pain points, so it's a mix of educating them, telling our story, letting them know of our service and how it would benefit them. It was our biggest challenge last year.

# What can you say about the advertising industry in the Philippines?

More and more companies are starting to adopt technology because, in the past five years, the ones that have been affected by technology are print and TV. But now is the time for out-of-home. If you look at other countries, billboards are adopting cameras to measure the traffic to really have data on how many cars passed them by. We don't have that here, and that is something I see we would be adopting soon.

Convenience stores and sari-sari stores also have the potential to adopt the technology. They'd want to analyze the people that come in and out of the stores as intelligence on consumer behavior.

# How about the growth of technology in the Philippines?

In terms of adoption and knowledge, a lot of Filipinos are very much willing to learn, which is good because we need to scale up. Al is going to augment a lot of jobs, and I think there are good people that are trying to push the scaling up. I just hope that regulators are as fast as how we're seeing the technology change. What I noticed is that when people get introduced to a new technology, their first reaction is fear and it hampers adoption—which is why we need to educate.

If you work in a corporate setting, what you learn is what your department needs. If you join a startup, you learn everything that happens in the startup because it's "all for one, one for all." If one department fails, everything fails. Everyone needs to be involved because what you do with the product affects everyone.

# How would you describe the way you manage AdMov Marketing Solutions?

My biggest mantra in hiring is that I don't hire for skills, I hire character. In terms of managing them as a leader, I focus highly on motivation. For me, if a person is highly motivated, then they will do great work for the company. How I do that is I try to align what they're doing to what they're currently interested in. One, they get to learn what they're interested in; and two, they're learning with motivation. There is a difference in output and productivity.

Also, I try to take care of the people, either in compensation or work-life balance. Each person has a target and deadline, but they are free to manage their own time as long as they deliver. From what I saw, if you give that flexibility, they actually deliver more because they will understand the value of what they're doing. If they understand how each little task is affecting the success of the company, they're more driven. If you take care of your employees, your employees take care of your clients.

Business Talk Extended An interview with the top executives of Japanese companies that have penetrated the Philippine market



Hideaki Kato is the President of Fuji Xerox Philippines since February 2018. The company offers office multifunction devices and solutions, which can reduce printing costs and streamline business processes. Having experiences in Shanghai, Singapore and Myanmar, Mr. Kato continues to expand the business overseas

#### Could you tell us about your business in the Philippines?

We offer multifunction devices, document solution software and digital press machines to our valued customers in the Philippines to make their business more efficient and more effective. We established the first overseas branch in the Philippines in 1965. Since then, our business has been growing always together with our customers in the Philippines. Although it was a tough time during the Asian financial crisis, our business has gradually expanded as the country grew. The business growth in provincial areas like Clark, Angeles City, and Davao City is remarkable. The demand for black & white printers is still major but at the same time, color printers and maintenance service business have increased. We have to deliver consistent customer support to the whole nation under terrible traffic jam and insufficient logistic infrastructures, which is one of the big challenges for us.

## How do you solve the challenge?

We just implemented e-invoice and e-payment services for our valuable customers. We also promote remote services of our multifunction devices, which enable remote monitoring and predictive support for customers.

#### What other plans do you have for the foreseeable future?

As we promote a new service called "Managed

Print Services," our customers can realize the most suitable printing environment and uncover hidden costs for printing. With graphic design and digital technology, we would also like to deliver added value to the Philippine printing industry.

#### How did you get into the industry?

I was born in Niigata Prefecture, raised in Tokyo, and enrolled at Meiji University. Working part-time in the hotel industry in Tokyo, I had many opportunities to talk with people from other countries. Because of this experience, I came to think that I would like to work using English. Japanese manufacturing industries had strong influences, so I got a job with Fuji Xerox in 1986.



# What role did you take after joining the company?

I worked in sales for five years in Tokyo, and then moved to the domestic sales planning department.

#### After that, how did you go on your career path?

I worked in Shanghai, covering the whole market in Asia Pacific. China was a huge market with 30 branches and 2,000 dealers. I felt the Chinese people often strongly expressed their opinion, which was a good attitude that helped me work and cooperate with them easily. Then, I moved to Myanmar.

### Could you tell us about your experiences in Myanmar?

I resided in Myanmar for five years from 2013 and studied the law and the tax system on establishing a new branch. Japan placed emphasis on cooperation with Myanmar. Myanmar saw a high market growth, which advanced annually at 6 to 8 percent. The number of Japanese companies registered in the chamber of commerce increased from 80 to 400 during my stay.

#### What is your principle in business?

When doing business in foreign countries, we have to show our respect and gratitude for the local society. The differences in culture are not the measure of good or bad and strong or weak.

#### What do you do in your free time?

I usually play sports, like golf and jogging with my family, travel, and take a walk. As we have eight branches and many channel partners in the Philippines, we sometimes travel on business.

#### What is your favorite quote?

My favorite is an ancient quote regarding Japanese leadership:

"You should do it yourself before him, you should tell him to do it, you should let him hear it, you should let him do it, and you should praise him, then, you let him do it."

That's a good method of management.

#### What is your favorite book?

My favorite book is "The Art of War," ancient Chinese military treatise by Sun Tzu. I like this quote: "If you know the enemy and know yourself, you need not fear the result of a hundred battles."

This quote is also applicable to planning a marketing strategy.
