Canned Goods

1 Pure Foods Chicken Homestyle Curry

This teems with a mellow taste thanks to the coconut milk!

2 Del Monte Cream Style Corn

Simply mix this with ample amount of chicken broth and eggs and you can already treat yourself to a Chinese-style soup.

3 Molinera Crushed Tomatoes

A can of this pureed tomatoes can be readily used as meat

4 Century Tuna Cornflakes

Apart from the fact that this brand gives off the taste that is closest to that of the Japanese tuna, this is a recommended canned good as it has 50% less fat and salt.

G Ciao Polpa do Pomodori

Acquire a good amount of authentic tomato juice with a can of peeled Italian tomatoes.

More than anything, a spray-type whipped cream is the one for those who value convenience.

Philippines' kesong puti or the local cheese variant made out of carabao milk is definitely cheaper than European cheese, but it still boasts of the same luscious taste.







3 DVF Carabao Milk

This version of the country's local milk is equipped with only a small amount of sweetness, so you may opt to get it if your sweet tooth is not ready for too much.

Supermarkets normally sell pre-sliced meats already. But if what you're looking for is not available, they can specially cut the displayed ones according to your preference. Some of the usual slices include adobo cuts, Stroganoff cuts, shabu-shabu cuts, and sukiyaki cuts. Meat slices can be as thin as just 2 mm.

However, since frozen meat can be hard to slice, you may opt to go as early as when the supermarket opens so you can readily have them cut.





Handling fish at home can indeed be tedious. But this should not scare you away from having fish dishes on your table, because most supermarkets will gladly do the work for you.

Simply choose the type of fish that you want and inform them of how you want it to be sliced. More so, remember that it is also possible to buy the internal organs alone.





Markets normally allow customers to purchase fruits per gram. Hence, if they're not packed or labeled with a fixed price, you may take your handful of fruits and have them scaled at the fruit counter.

Of course, the prices vary greatly depending on how much they weigh.

Nagtabon Beach

The west coast of Puerto Princesa is home to the best off-the-beaten-path beaches in the province. About an hour away from the airport and the city center, Nagtabon Beach is a secluded beach that is recently rising as a surfing spot in Puerto Princesa. Surfboards can be rented at the beach, and facilities like nipa cottages, toilets, shower area, and small restaurants are available. The peak time for surfing is from October to March. There is a viewing deck, 5 mins. away from the beach, that lets you admire the entirety of the beach from a high spot.

Talaudyong Beach

If you're looking for some peace and quiet, this is the place to be. While surfing is also possible here, Talaudyong Beach is best for laidback activities aimed at re-energizing the mind. The cove's cream-colored sand is hemmed in by coconut trees, punctuated by local fishing boats—a nice scenery for barefoot strolls or splashing in the calm waters.

Along the beach, there are rental gazebos and nipa huts, and sari-sari stores for snacks and refreshments.

Sabang Beach

Just a 15-min. walk away from Sabang Port, the jump-off for Underground River-bound boats, Sabang Beach features a boho beach vibe with its long stretch of quirky restaurants and bars, and laidback resorts facing the beach. The soft, fine sand also allows for a relaxing and scenic walk, with views of the nearby rainforest. Visitors coming from the Underground River tour may opt to be dropped off at Sabang Beach (depending on weather conditions).

honda bay

Rich in not only aquatic life but also terrestrial ecosystems, the whole Honda Bay is a protected area encompassing around 16 islands. Only five of which—plus one coral ree nursery—are open to tourists. In one tour, the maximum allowable number of spots is 3.

Ideal for snorkeling and fish feeding, Starfish Island got its name from the numerous huge starfishes that inhabit its shores. Luli and Cowrie are rather bustling islands with tourist facilities like restaurants and activity rentals. The primary feature of Luli is its sandbar that earned the island its name, derived from the Filipino term, "Iulubog-lilitaw," referring to how it disappears and appears at the rise and fall of the tides. Meanwhile, Cowrie Island is usually where tour groups have lunch at the





buffet-style Filipino restaurant (P300/person; included in a tour package)

The coral reef nursery that is Pambato Reef lets you watch and get close to different kinds, sizes, and colors of fish swimming among the corals. Aside from the fish, you can also find giant clams.

The tour usually starts from 7 am (pick-up from hotel) and ends at 2 pm (departure back to wharf). If you want better chances of avoiding big crowds, set your departure the earliest time possible. Bring extra cash (and put it in a waterproof case) for activities and extra snacks. Jetski, kayak, and banana boat fees are not included in the tour.





underground river

One of the world's longest navigable rivers, the Puerto Princesa Underground River reaches a length of 8.2 km, with more still waiting to be explored. A boat tour only takes visitors across 1.5 km for about 40 mins. to 1 hour. An extended tour of up to 4 km. is possible with approval from the tourism office.



Each guest is provided with an audio guide device, available in different languages including English, Chinese, Korean, German, Spanish, and French. Throughout the tour, there are various rock formations that can tickle your imagination and overwhelm you with wonders.

The Underground River is a designated National Park and recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1999. In 2012, it was accepted as one of the 7 Wonders of Nature.

Ugong Rock

Ugong Rock refers both to the humongous limestone formation and the expanse of unspoiled nature that teems with an exhilarating adventure and peaceful nature. This is primarily through the foremost activities, caving/spelunking (P200) and zip-lining (P250–P350). It normally takes 20 minutes to climb the steep Ugong Rock, reverberating with echoes of the hollow cave formations.

Kitu-Kito Firefly Watching



Kitu-Kito D'Makarios is the next big firefly watching destination after the closure of the first at Iwahig River earlier this year. The firefly watching site is a virgin mangrove area home to countless fireflies that sparkle at night. Note that there are many insects in the area; use natural/non-toxic insect repellents like citronella oil. Otherwise, wear long sleeves or jacket, pants, and closed shoes.





First established in 1869, Tanukikoji Shopping Arcade may also be considered a historical attraction. This quaint covered shopping arcade houses around 200 shops, some decades-old and some newer. A good variety can be explored in a span of 900m—there are restaurants and pubs, fashion stores, thrift shops, and even hotels. The most popular is MEGA Don Quijote, Japan's trendiest discount chain store, open 24 hours. Also be on the lookout for entryways that lead to more amazing shops and restaurants hidden underground and on upper floors.

Odori Park

Odori Park is a green oasis that cuts across the city center 1.5km from east to west. For both locals and tourists, it is the most accessible and affordable breathing space filled with around 90 kinds of trees that turn different colors across the seasons. If you go up Sapporo TV Tower, a 147.2m tower at the park's eastern end, your view to the west will consist of the whole Odori Park and mountains like Maruyama and Okurayama that fill the horizon. The tower is also lit up every night, a spectacle that stands out amid the nighttime cityscape.



Moerenuma Park

Moerenuma Park is a huge masterpiece carved out of what was once a waste disposal site. Now, this 188.8-ha land harbors some of the most amazing man-made landscapes and sculptures that utilize tasteful geometry and mingle art with nature.

There are about 14 facilities with different activities for kids and adults. The park's most symbolic structure is the Hidamari Glass Pyramid, which houses a gallery dedicated to the park's designer, Isamu Noguchi, a multi-purpose space where you can lounge beneath the glass walls, souvenir shops, and a French restaurant called L'enfant Qui Reve. Another interesting feature is Mt. Moere, a man-made hill 62m. high, which provides a good vantage point to view the entirety of the park and Sapporo City.

Bike rental is available from ¥200 to ¥300. Winter sport equipment can also be rented from early January to early May.

Takino Suzuran Hillside Park

The only goverment-managed park in Hokkaido, Takino Suzuran Hillside Park boasts a vast array of landscape features, facilities, and scenery across 400 hectares. The park has four zones dedicated to different kinds of activities: the Chushin Zone with scenic flower gardens, camping grounds, big playgrounds, and a golf course; the Takino no Mori West Zone for forest activities; the Takino no Mori East Zone for forest walks and cooking activities; and the Keiryu Zone for biking, fishing, picnics, and a waterfall tour.

Being admission-free and closest to the highway, the Keiryu Zone is the most accessible. A must-try activity is biking while going on an excursion around the falls in this zone, namely, Masumi, Shiraho, and Ashiribetsu. The falls are also a wonderful sight when they are frozen during winter. Bike rental is available at Park Station, near Masumi Guchi Gate.

Glossary:

- Private bank financial services for wealthy individuals such as asset owners and corporate owners; a bank with a dedicated staff who comprehensively manages assets according to customer asset conditions and life plans.
- Capital ratio the capital (total assets) held by a bank that can be broadly divided into two categories: "equity" and "money borrowed from others". "Equity capital" means money (capital) that a bank has issued and has raised its own shares.
- Accumulated profits (retained earnings)

 retained earnings)

 percentage of net profits that are accumulated and used for reinvestment purposes. These can also be used to pay down debts rather than being paid out in dividends. The accumulated profit is often used by corporations to invest in areas that will create growth opportunities.
- Equity ratio refers to the ratio of equity to total assets. It is said that the higher the value is, the more healthy the management is, and it is used as one of the indicators of a management's status.

Tips:

- Partner with a bank that meets your needs. If you are a busy bee, it's best to choose a bank that gives you easy access to ATM around you- whether in malls, near your house or office.
- Put safety and privacy first. Choose a bank that immediately notifies via e-mail or text should there be any suspicious activity on your account and gives speedy action towards it.
- According to Moneymax, make sure that your chosen bank is a member of the Philippine Deposit Insurance Corporation (PDIC) to ensure a maximum of P500,000 deposit insurance coverage.
- 4. Do not be afraid to consult a bank representative should you have any questions or clarifications before you sign anything with your chosen bank.
- 5. When making online bank transactions, secure your phones and/or computer by making sure to have an updated anti-virus software. Also keep your firewall up to keep your data private.



Business Talk An interview with the top executives in the Philippines Get a first person point of view when it Get a first person point of view when it comes to business



Paolo Bugayong is the co-founder and CEO of AIDE Mobile App, a home health care platform serving the greater Metro Manila area. Established in 2016 by the Bugayong siblings, AIDE has since been providing medical services that include blood work, doctor visit, and medicine delivery all in the comfort of patients' homes. Currently, AIDE is an Ayala company and has over 200,000 users registered on the app.

Bugayong is an economics graduate of the Ateneo de Manila University where he received the prestigious Gerry Roxas Leadership Award. He then continued his studies at the University of California, Berkeley for finance. Before setting out to be an entrepreneur, he was involved in the field of corporate finance.

Can you tell us about AIDE? How did it start and what is the business all about?

In 2016, my siblings and I thought about this (AIDE) because our grandmother needed medical attention. She was already immobile, and it did not make sense to take her to the car and drive all the way to Makati or wherever the hospital is just to get medical care. Because of the traffic and the chaotic lines and systems, it can be tough. And then we thought, "Wouldn't it be nice to get healthcare to come to your home?" That's where it all started. This is a sibling-run business. My youngest brother, who is a medical school graduate, takes care of the medical side. My sister is in the customer service side so she handles operations. We are a good mix. I handle finance, business development, and others.

I have about 200,000 Filipino patients in my app. I grow constantly each day at about 100 to 300 new users. I have hit about 200 transactions in a day and this number is continuously growing. In the supply side, we have about 4,000 medical professionals—a mix of doctors, nurses, caregivers, and physical therapists.

Can you walk us through your flagship services and how the application works?

Our main services would be, number one, blood work. That is, taking your blood in your home,

bringing it to our lab partners, and then you'll get the results in the app. Part of my vision is that even when you go to the hospital or to another doctor, all your information is here in the AIDE app.

Number two, nursing care. When I say nursing care, it's short-term and long-term care. Long-term care will be 30 days; one week maybe for a sick family member.

Number three is the doctor visit and next would be medicine delivery. When you're sick, you just have to book a doctor to come to your house. It may be on the premium side like P2,500, but in terms of the value of time, you'll be able to save a lot. You'll be able to do other things while waiting for the doctor. And, of course, the medicine delivery and the vaccines. That's pretty quick. For medicine delivery, you just order, send a prescription, and we'll deliver it in a hundred minutes or less.

You could pay in the app through credit card, GCash, or cash.

How can a patient get assigned with a particular doctor?

All you have to do is put in who's sick or who needs it, and then put in the time and day that you need a doctor. Then, put in the location where you want the doctor to go, and some notes—the symptoms, what you are feeling, etc. Then, you click "Find a Doctor." True enough, after a few minutes, you'll find around three to four doctors that can do your request. Some are more experienced, some are newcomers, and some are actually your neighbor, so that's interesting.

What are the challenges you have encountered in AIDE, and how did you deal with them?

I had to find a bigger reason to keep going. Because just like any business, you know that income will come later, and for a start-up-when 1 say start-up, I mean I'm the first in the country-so I had to build, I had to market, I had to sell, I had to hire, and I had to fundraise all at the same time.

We did the product development in 2016, and I.

said, the first thing I would do is to acquire a tech mentor because I need somebody to tell me if I'm doing the right thing. And then, in October 2017, our numbers went up. That was the inflection point. That was when we decided our strategy would be to focus on 100 customers and make them very, very, very happy; because by doing that, they will spread the word. And that's what we did. Anything they wanted, even if it's not to scale or nothing to do with technology, we would do it just to make them happy. And true enough, it never stopped from there. Our big break came when Ayala invested in AIDF.

Before you take a health service, you want to make sure who is in. Partnering with Ayala was the biggest value that contributed to our credibility. Being an Ayala company, we were taught about the best practices, how to properly vet the doctors, and how to properly record and monitor the transactions. Now, when you say AIDE is an Ayala company, at least the wall is smaller. At least the trust part is better.

How would you describe your management style?

My management style in the beginning was more of a team player role because I was trying to find the product fit. I'm the CEO, I'm the messenger, I'm the HR-I'm everything. In other words, you have to be flexible and willing to wear many hats. So my style today is I try my best to empower my team. It's very important that I don't think for them. The vision is clear, here's the main goal; I want to hear their thoughts, and I will pick the best idea that I think will work. The last one is hiring the right talent. I devote a lot of time in hiring the right people.

How would you describe the work relation-ships in AIDE?

I always tell everyone we're like riding an airplane and I'm the captain. I need to continuously strategize. I cannot be bogged down with operation problems or other problems. It's a machine, they have to keep on going while I continue to ride this airplane. I have to continue flying it.

Who are the people you look up to?

I only have two people in my mind-they would be my father and my father-in-law.

My father would always tell me, "You see these great businessmen out there, they all have their own story, and they all went through their own struggles. There's no shortcut to success. If you want to succeed, you have to just work hard. There's no other secret. Look at every day like it's your best day. Work well with full integrity and full excellence." He always tells me that. So I wake up each day and give it my best. I will struggle well. I will be a great leader. I will be a great team player. It's the same with my father-in-law; he taught me how to be a manager among many things.

But the most important thing that I received from these two was, "Dream big, but don't forget to put your feet on the ground." We can always dream big, but if you don't embrace reality, you are not going to succeed. You have to be real.

Business Talk Extended An interview with the top executives of Japanese companies that have penetrated the Philippine market



Makiko Takaoka is the general manager of Nomura Research Institute (NRI) Singapore -Manila branch. Having interest in the human behaviors and values during her school days, Takaoka is now focusing on supporting domestic and overseas companies through comprehensive human-related work such as human capital consulting and management. With a passionate mind and a sharp foresight, she looks at the whole of Asia and lays the foundation for economic development.

Takaoka was born in Fukuoka Prefecture, Japan, in 1977. She spent her childhood in Latin America, England, and Indonesia. She entered Kobe University Graduate School of Human Sciences where she majored in anthropology and got the chance to do field work in the Philippines. She joined NRI in 2002 and, four years later, moved to the Manila branch of NRI Singapore.

Could you tell us about the NRI business in the Philippines?

We provide market research and consulting, as well as sytems solution. We conduct market and industry research and search for partners who want to enter the Philippines, conduct due diligence, support new businesses, and offer HR consulting to companies that have already entered the Philippines.

As for me, HR consulting has so much attractiveness in approaching people because there is not always a single right answer. No matter how good a strategy, system, or process, it is up to the people who implement them. It feels very rewarding to visualize things that are difficult to see, and support the client to solve issues.

Now, we have been developing services not only in the Philippines but also in other Asian countries. We facilitate workshops for the next-generation leaders of client companies in Japan, Thailand, and Hong Kongas well as,

conducting remote coaching. This can be done because of high English proficiency and adaptability of our members.

How much we can contribute to social issues and how much we can provide higher value is more important. 77

What is your management style?

Management for me is about leading and supporting an organization to maximize its value. There is no growth without a concrete revenue base, but achieving sales and profit targets is not a goal. How much we can contribute to social issues and how much we can provide higher value is more important.

In order to increase the value of an organization, it is important not to play by yourself but to maximize the potential of team members. Though I'm busy with my day-to-day work, I like to think about mid to long-term vision of the organization.

You have so much interest in people.

The origin of my interest in people goes back to junior high school days, when I stayed in England and Indonesia due to my father's work. Looking at 13-year-old children in London convey their opinions in their own words and Indonesian children work at the same age as mine at that time, I came to think, "What is human happiness and true wealth?"

In the university, I belonged to an NGO that

deepened my views on children's rights and in graduate school, I majored in anthropology. I stayed in the Philippines for a year to do field work and interviewed 100 working children in Baguio. They were not just limited to the unfortunate and the poor children, but each one had a different background, family relationships, and dreams for the future. At that time, I learned resilience from them.

Can you tell us more about focused services?

We are promoting a new business space on "Digital Transformation (DX)" that uses data and technology to transform existing operations and create new businesses.

For example, in the human resource field, if we can analyze the characteristics of high performers from the accumulated human resource data and create criteria for hiring, it would be so worthy. Moreover, we try to catch up with blockchain techonology in the financial field. NRI's philosophy is, "Dream up the future." In the Philippine branch, each consultant will continue to take on the challenge and to provide higher value to customers and society.

What is your perspective on economics and government in the Philippines?

The attractive point in the Philippines is that the population is still growing. I think that economic development will continue as the population is young and domestic consumption is brisk. Tourism seems to have more room for growth.

The Duterte administration has enough experience in the past in Davao. On the other hand, domestic manufacturing sector is not growing enough and they have to rely on import to respond to increasing domestic consumption. I think it is necessary to have a strong will to foster even one or two priority manufacturing sector/s with proper incentives and government-led development. The difficult part of doing the strategy is to choose something and give up something.

I think that if the domestic industry grows and the middle-class increases, socio-economic disparities

What should be done to ensure that all people can live happily with human dignity and not economic development that only benefits some people? This is one of the questions I want to keep trying to answer seriously.

How you spend your private time?

I spend my time with my family. I have three sons. Home management is always harder because they are so energetic and always quarrelling. On weekends, we play in the park, go shopping together, play card games at home, borrow DVDs from the Japanese Association Library, and watch Japanese movies together. I try to make time to talk with my kids. I want my children to grow up with the strength to believe in what they have decided to accomplish.






