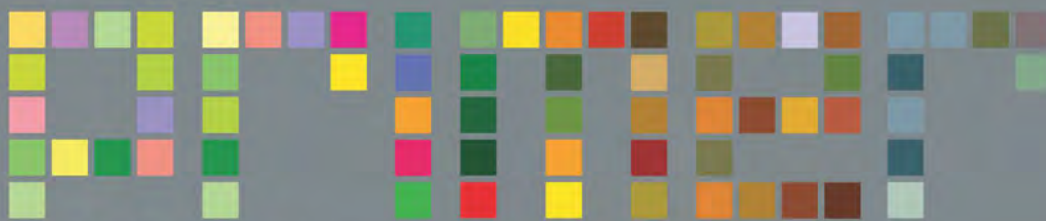

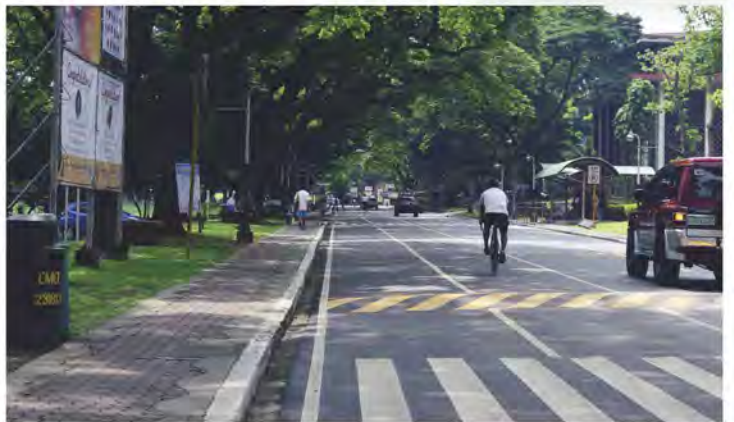

Applications Offering “Pabili” Services

With the advent of delivery services that at present cover almost anything one can buy, the existence of different delivery couriers is no stranger to consumers anymore. And if it makes internet shopping any better, a lot of these have now also been offering *pabili* services that are even handier in light of our stay-at-home situation.

What is *pabili* service and how does it work?

Pabili is a Filipino word that means to ask someone to buy something for you—which in essence is what the namesake service is all about. Just open the delivery app of your choice, tap the *pabili* service icon, and from there type in the store you need to shop from and indicate which items you need. This is not limited to just food, so you can definitely have whatever items you need from the stores outside. However, the only downside of such is that the amount you can have the riders buy is limited from app to app.

But to help you decide which *pabili* service you would want to avail next time to maximize the experience, we looked into some of the most prominent delivery applications in the Philippines and summed up the information you would likely want to know.

Tidying Up Your Space



The minimalist method of decluttering has seen quite a spike in popularity after minimalist organizing gurus became widely publicized. Such a method, while undoubtedly helpful in clearing up piles after piles of things, also lends a hand in keeping one's zen in perfect harmony at the same time. And with all the uncertainties happening right now that give people no better choice than to stay in 24/7, what looks to be the most ideal thing to do in such times is to make homes a place where you can feel safe and attain utmost relaxation.

Among the multifarious decluttering methods centered on minimalism that are now known to many, we give the spotlight this time to two of the most distinct methods rooted in Japan where minimalism lies in the heart of most spaces—an otherwise contrast to the being sentimental of Filipinos that thereby affect the way they approach their homes and spaces.

DANSHARI METHOD

In Japan, they have what they call the "Danshari Method"—a concept popularized by Fumio Sasaki, which is closely tied with the minimalist teachings of Zen Buddhism.

The Japanese word 'danshari' is made up of three kanji characters, each equating to the following definitions:

Dan - to refuse

This simply means to refuse spending on things that will serve no purpose for you in the long run. Before purchasing something, firstly assess if it's really worth buying and taking up space in your home; if not, it's time to move forward with your shopping cart and not give in to the temptation.

Sha - to dispose

Aside from throwing your clutter straight in the garbage, you can either donate them to organizations or earn some extra cash by selling them in a traditional garage sale or in any available online platform.

Ri - to separate

Learning to separate oneself from their material possessions is the most important concept in the Danshari Method. This means being satisfied with the things you have and realizing that being happy and content in life comes beyond just acquiring possessions.

In a nutshell, the Danshari Method is traditional minimalism with the purpose of not only decluttering your space but also your mind. After all, a tidy home is always a welcoming sight and is a great environment to get some work done and unwind afterward.

KONMARI METHOD

The KonMari Method, similar to the danshari idealism, is another way of decluttering by means of keeping only the items that spark joy in life. It is an idea founded by Japanese tidying expert and bestselling author Marie Kondo, whose method embraces a minimalist lifestyle in terms of tidying your stuff by category and letting go of things that do not spark joy anymore.

While the Danshari Method lies on three major principles, the KonMari Method embodies six basic rules to live by:

RULE 1

→ Commit yourself to tidying up.

RULE 2

→ Imagine your ideal lifestyle.

RULE 3

→ Finish discarding first.

RULE 4

→ Tidy by category, not by location.

RULE 5

→ Follow the right order.

RULE 6

→ Ask yourself if it sparks joy.

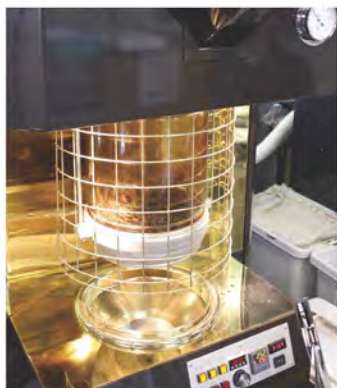

BIKING DOWN THE METRO

Pre-COVID 19, bikes have already been treading along the city roads albeit the scarcity of lanes dedicated to them. And now, more than ever, these numbers have visibly increased as the pandemic brought with it a constantly shifting landscape involving public transportation—no less the need to be at an acceptable distance away from other people. Let's not forget that more than being a convenient transportation means, biking also has several benefits such as aiding in weight management, improving one's core and lower body strength, and easing one's negative emotions as you cycle.

To give beginners a head start on biking down Metro Manila, Philippine Primer offers a refresher on what you need to know about it, from the guidelines involving such a mode of transport and the bike lanes you can find around, down to the bike-friendly places in the city and some of the most reliable bike shops where you can cop a unit that is perfect for you.

Biking Regulations

At present, there is no law of some sort covering the use of bicycles in the Philippines. There are, instead, acts introduced by former senators that are unfortunately yet to be passed. But for the utmost safety of cyclists, basic biking etiquettes include the wearing of helmet and shoes; the use of headlight, tail light, and other reflective materials; and the strict limiting of just one (1) passenger. Cyclists, like drivers of any other vehicle, must comply with the traffic laws as well atop the general etiquette in cycling.

Metro Manila Bike Lanes

Not all main roads including EDSA have bike lanes yet, but there have been initiatives both from the national and local governments to begin their establishment, more especially in light of the COVID-19 pandemic that crippled public transport. As of publishing, cities equipped with said protected lanes are Quezon City, San Juan, Pasig, Manila, and Marikina (see bit.ly/Bike-Lanes for a more comprehensive list). Bikes are also allowed on sidewalks but only if the bike lane is situated within them, just like in BGC.

The Brick Multisport Store

The Brick Multisport Store was born out of a goal in sharing and deepening the passion for cycling. Whether you're starting your journey to adapt to the 'new normal' way of going to work or to try your hand on a new bodily activity and pastime, The Brick probably has one that suits you best—from entry-level bikes to bespoke ones. Their selection is especially centered on upscale units namely built bikes such as GT and Wilier, Cherubim or the custom handmade steel bicycles from Japan, and Fetska bikes largely meant for race cycling.
